



Of all the senses, the ability to see is perhaps the most important. The person who has been born blind cannot know what color real-blind canno The person who has been born bilind cannot know what color really maens or the appearance of other human beings. One who has become bilind after having been able to see is in an almost equally bad situation.

Many cases of blindness, whether present at birth or developing later in life, can be prevented. Active in seeking to avoid unnecessary blindness is the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness.

This organization is interested in any measures which can be used to prevent loss of vision. Recently it held its 40th anniversary conference at which many papers were presented and numerous suggestions offered for combating loss of vision.

The most important preventive is to obtain the best possible advice at the earliest possible moment. Infections of the eye and other defects which may lead to blindness can frequently be treated with complete success if caught early.




