### Idle Benefit Claims Drop

End of Vacation Lay-off Is Reason for Fewer Unemployed

Hartford, Aug. 3.—(AP)—With vacation shutdowns over in many Connecticut factories, claims for unemployment benefits dropped from 98,286 to 90,173 during the week ending July 30. In reporting the decrease, the State Labor department said today that claims for the same period in 1948 totaled 98,213. Initial claims, starting new periods of unemployment were 9,063 for the week against 9,750 for the week previous. Bridgeport still led the state in the number of jobs lost, with 16,477, followed by Hartford with 10,419, Waterbury 10,356, New Haven 9,562, and New Britain 7,005.
