(Continued from Page One)

Hoover issued a special commission on government organization which recently completed a two-year study with a report recommending "economies of four million dollars a year."

In his talk, broadcast by the major networks, he said: "On my way to New York, I was told by my fellow workers on this 15th birthday in 1934, the founding fathers dedicated the structure of our government to secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity. It is not too late to do this."

The American people have solved many great crises in national life. The qualities of endurance and courage still live in our people. It is not too late to solve these crises.

Assailing new Federal and state proposals for spending taxes, he said:

"Socialism or Fascism... Among these roads of spending, the government either takes which is socialism, or dictates institutional and economic life which is fascism."

He said "The American mind is troubled by the growth of collectivism."
