Who is Injuring UN?
 Warren R. Austin, our chief delegate to the United Nations, speaks up at "Manchester" tonight, devoting the main burden of his address to a warning to the opponents of world government.

Mr. Austin warned that "great care" must be used in advancing the cause of world government, and that its advocates should be sure that they did nothing which might injure the United Nations.

The damage which might come to the United Nations he visualized as follows: "There might be involved a separation of the members of the United Nations into different federations or voluntary associations."

It is on that basis that Mr. Austin denounces the world government movement and warns its participants.

These are some validly in his warning, and all thoughtful followers of the world government movement are quite aware of the danger of a world government, but he is, in our opinion, too premature and rashly in his warning, and up by dividing it more definitely than ever.

But the followers of world government at least at world unity, and their proposals are constructive rather than destructive. The side they might take would be at least to be taken in an effort to move the world forward.

But what of other divisive moves and policies which have no such constructive aim? In Mr. Austin's equally quick and eloquent to condemn those threats to the United Nations which merely tear the United Nations apart without promising to build it up again? Mr. Austin fears the development, if the world government comes in the shape of "different federations or voluntary associations."

What does he call the North Atlantic Pact? Is that not a policy of world division? Does that not, for all real purposes, substitute for the United Nations, for those nations who are members of the North Atlantic Pact, a new arrangement which, in any showdown, will claim first allegiance over the allegiance these nations have given to the United Nations?

What does Mr. Austin call the Soviet bloc of nations? Or the proposed Pacific bloc? In Mr. Austin's real and proposed, doing more to divide the world than any proposal for world government could ever do? And are they not dividing the world in the name and in the principle of power politics? And isn't power politics, with its inevitably destructive end, doing more harm to the United Nations than could ever come from sane proposals that the world might move forward to its inevitable political destiny?

If Mr. Austin believes his own logic, and is speaking as an individual rather than as the official representative of government policy, we expect his next public address to contain a warning against the North Atlantic Pact and all similar arrangements. They are the things which represent the deadly peril to the United Nations.

Laggard Senate
 Even while this country has been pressing unrestricted trade agreements abroad, particularly to Britain, the United States Senate has now allowed our own

Reciprocal Trade Agreements Act
 to lapse since July 30. The House found time to accomplish its role of renewal last February, when it passed the first time in the history of the reciprocal trade policy, a majority of the Republicans in the House voted for it.

The Senate, unfortunately, has waited until a time of economic recession to intensify the campaign against the reciprocal trade program.

Yet the issue is larger than the welfare of certain specific American industries. If there are such industries which have not found the way to face an absence of artificial protection for themselves, there are even healthier American industries to whom low tariff rates are good news.

Not in Connecticut, for instance, we have watch making industry, which for these past few years, has thrived best when it is allowed to purchase market in the world market, thus evading the protectionist price the western copper interests like to maintain. If we examine the tariff situation item by item, in other words, we find that it cuts both ways.

Thus, Mr. Spackburn could not be elected to his new post until he had ceased to be a member of the Belgian cabinet. Winston Churchill led the assembly in denouncing the candidate for vice presidency of a British cabinet who was considered to have British cabinet status. The official heads of government are at Strasbourg, sitting in the Council of Europe's "Committee of Ministers," the so-called upper house of the new legislative assembly.

But the members of the Assembly itself are already cutting loose from the cautious and restricted attitude of Committee of Ministers, and demanding for themselves freedom for a course of conduct entirely apart from the official policy of the governments represented at Strasbourg.

They are all visualizing something better, something more important, something more glorious, than loyal service to their own nations. The extreme exponents of pure nationalism might consider Mr. Spackburn and others nothing more than pseudo-traitors, that they dare conceive and follow some interest higher than that of their own nation as an individual nation. But those who think most seriously about the future of the world and all its nations may concede that they have found a new and higher order of patriotism.
