Train Wreck Near Bolton

Five Freight Cars Derailed at Steele's Crossing Early Today

Five cars of "The Bullet," fast Worcester-New Haven freight train of the New Haven railroad which carries perishable goods, were derailed at Steele's crossing just east of Bolton Notch shortly after 1 o'clock this morning. Railroad spokesmen said there were no injuries, but added that considerable damage had been done to the single track road bed.

Train crews from Providence and East Hartford reported at the scene early this morning and at 11 o'clock this morning several cars were derailed by giant railroaders. An official indicated that the cars would be righted and the road clear this evening in time for Train 131, due here at 9:30 p. m.

Leahie Tyler, public relations chief of the New Haven Railroad, said the cause of the accident has not yet been determined. He stated that there were 16 cars in the train, and of the cars derailed, one was carrying wood pulp, another newspaper, two cars were loaded with lumber and the fifth with scrap zinc. "The Bullet" was bound for New Haven.

The accident cancelled departure from Hartford of Train 130, an early morning Boston train, due here at 8:30 a. m. and its passengers were taken by bus to Williams station where another train was made up. They were delayed less than 40 minutes.

Two freight and two passenger trains a day over the line were cancelled over another division, officials said.

Urges Catholics To Be Militant

Portland, Ore., Aug. 17—Senator J. Howard McGrath urged Catholics to battle for Christianism and democracy in a speech last night that opened the Supreme convention of the Knights of Columbus.

The Democratic party national chairman said the church must be militant. He warned that the church is being used as a tool by the communists and that the division's rifts and mortal wits, the 19th, 17th and 18th century, must be healed. McGrath then criticized what he called the "crisis of the church" which would devastate and glorify sense and sensuality, above spirit and conscience in the United States. The Rhode Island senator said "piety and patriotism alike demand a reuniting of the college of our Christian civilization."

Labor Short On Potatoes

State Agency Calls on Raisers to Solicit Pickers Needed

Hartford, Aug. 17—State Labor Commissioner John L. Egan today reported that a shortage of labor for harvest of potatoes is in prospect this year. Local offices of the State Employment Service have been urged to solicit orders for additional potato pickers needed to complete the harvest, he said.

Commissioner Egan declared that normally 800 to 900 pickers are required, but with some of the growers reporting near crop failures and others greatly reduced yield, it is expected that the number required will be materially decreased this year. This crop, he noted, is principally raised in the vicinity of Hartford areas.

277 Pickers Needed

W. Marham and Edward L. Crook, managers of the Connecticut State Employment Service local offices in these areas have already submitted a survey which shows a total need as evidenced by orders placed to date with their offices of 277 pickers, throughout the Rockville, Ellington, and Wapping area.

According to a report today by Commissioner John Christensen of the State Department of Farms and Markets, a potato crop totaling 2,808,000 bushels is estimated for Connecticut as of Aug. 1.

Parking Rule Is Criticized
Town Officials Debate Free Time on Meters; May Change the Law
The Board of Directors last night took steps to do away with the parking rule on Main street, and that use of parking tickets to motorists who use "free time" on Manchester's parking meters without depositing coins in the contrivances.

Director John Lappen, who introduced the subject of a regulation change, explained that he has found "great criticism" of the rule on the free time use. Manchester's meter regulations require that a motorist show much "free" time may show on a meter when a motorist drives into a stall, and that he must deposit one cent for the use of the space, or face the issuance of a citation if he puts in the cent, he may use the 12 minutes the coin buys, plus the free time that originally showed.

Director Lappen said that most people are not aware of this requirement, and that they are liable to a penalty out of all proportion to the one cent involved. He asserted that the continuing force of such "small irritations" would "make enemies for the town." He said that he would request enforcement of the rule and had found most people agree.

Mayor Harold A. Turkington said that he thought that criticism of this part of the meter regulations was justified. He observed that any new installation causes comment and controversy, some of which is merely opposition to innovation of any kind. He said that it seemed to him the rule in question would only be an irritation, and of no real value to the basic parking problem.

The idea behind the parking meter installation, the Mayor said, is to cause a more rapid parking turnover and thus afford increased opportunities to park. The plan was not adopted to raise revenue, which is incidental to the parking correction, he stated. He doubted that the free time part could be enforced, and he said that he thought the regulation should be changed.
