Dependent parents of a World War II veteran whose death was service connected may be entitled to compensation: if they do not have an income sufficient to provide reasonable maintenance for themselves and members of their family under legal age, or members of the family otherwise dependent by reason of mental or physical incapacity, according to Director Walter Ford of the Veterans Service Center. The monthly compensation rates are \$60 for one parent or \$35 each for two parents.

"If the death of the veteran occurred subsequent to service," said Ford, "discharge must have been under other than dishonorable conditions. In determining dependency," he added, "amount received by the parents from the deceased veteran's National Bervice Life Insurance will be disregarded."






