**Guilford Loses Suit on Beach**

Supreme Court Rules 15 of Acre Property Of Three Individuals

Hartford, Aug. 22.—The State Supreme court ruled today that 15 of an acre of beach on Bloody Cove, adjoining Great Oyster Bay, belongs to three individuals and is not community property in the town of Guilford.

The decision rejected the town's appeal from a Superior court ruling giving title to sections of the beach to D. Spencer Berger, New Haven coast manufacturer and yachtman, and to two other owners of adjoining property, George T. Sperry and Edith M. Gulliver. The title goes back to 1778 when the Guilford proprietors made allocations of common land in Great Oyster Bay to various individuals. Highway Given An Boundary Land Records give a boundary running between Great Oyster Bay and Bloody Cove as the southern boundary of the town of Guilford. Berger and his fellow property owners contended their land extended to high water mark. The town insisted that their rights ended at the high water mark. The Supreme court said evidence in the case, heard by a referee who reported to the Superior court, gave "adequate support" for the referee's finding that the boundary between the beach itself was referred to as the highway. Thus, said the court, "a boundary of the highway" was equivalent to a boundary on the high-water mark.

**Singer Strike Parleys Held**

Special Committee to Continue to Work for Settlement

Bridgport, Aug. 22.—The chairman of a special committee named to attempt settlement of the long-drawn-out Singer manufacturing company strike reported only that "we will continue to work on the problem" after the third meeting of the nine-man group.

The committee went into session early yesterday afternoon, and did not break up until early today.

Not Done Yet for Session

Though the Rev. James T. Murphy of St. Ann's Roman Catholic church said the committee's work would continue, he set no date for a fourth session.

The committee conferred separately, and behind closed doors, with officials of the sewing machine manufacturing company and the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers (U. E. M. W.).
