May Not Die From Wound

Surgeon Gives New Haven Patrolman Good Chance to Recover

New Haven, Aug. 27.—(P)—A surgeon has given Patrolman John H. Hanning, shot with his own gun by a burglar prisoner in the city court house, a good chance for recovery.

Dr. Robert N. Wilbur, senior in surgery, says that the popular 65-year-old veteran policeman has "greatly improved" as a result of blood transfusions and plasma since his admission to the Hospital of St. Raphael yesterday morning.

Shot beneath the back of his head, Dr. Wilbur said that the single .38 slug which entered the policeman's abdomen has lodged beneath the skin of his back and "can be removed by a comparatively simple operation," which will be performed as soon as Hanning's condition warrants.

Reid Denby, 27-year-old Negro who was awaiting psychiatric examination when he went berserk in the city court prisoners' pen, told Detective Capt. Raymond Hagan he shot Hanning "because the Lord told me to get out of jail."

"I'm sorry I shot him," the police official quoted Denby as saying.

Sent to State Hospital Shortly after the shooting two psychiatrists, summoned by Assistant State Attorney Arthur T. Gorman, termed him a "schizophrenic with acute hallucination confusion." He was sent to the Connecticut State hospital on an emergency 30-day commitment.

Gorman said that if Denby is released at the end of the 30 days he will call a grand jury to inquire into the shooting.
