**Deny Reports Of Red Moves**

**Yugoslav Diplomats Repudiate Flood of Rumors on Pressure**

Belgrade, Yugoslavia, Aug. 28.—Yugoslav government spokesmen were kept busy today denying a flood of rumors about moves and counter-moves in the increasingly heated world war between Russia and Yugoslavia.

But the Yugoslav government and people were calm despite the reports that Russia and her obedient satellites might use force or attempt to stir a revolt against the regime of Premier Marshall Tito.

There was not one solid fact to back up any of the rumors of sabotage, troop movements and spying that flew from table to table in coffee shops and were whispered in diplomatic corridors.

Foreign Minister Edvard Kardelj and Politburo Member Milovan Djilas found time yesterday to attend a tractor exhibition in Yugoslavia, Belgium and France.

The Yugoslav press continued to carry news of the Communist bloc and the other Communist nations who have been threatening Tito since they threw him out of the organization in May, 1948.

**Red Council Meets**  
The official Soviet news agency Tass, in a dispatch from London this morning that the economic organization of Europe's Communist nations is being reorganized. It is reported that since they threw him out of the organization in May, 1948.

The Tass announcement did not say what was discussed but stated that representatives of Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Poland, Romania, Czechoslovakia and Russia considered current questions of its work and took necessary decisions.

There was no hint that the Tito regime was discussed at the meeting. The Communist nations have been tightening an economic boycott of Yugoslavia to the point where there is practically no trade between them.

Hartford, Aug. 28.—(P)—Misunderstanding of the Marshall plan and the operating processes of the Economic Co-operation Administration (ECA) is causing the Hartford Field office of the Department of Commerce a lot of unnecessary trouble.

"Many businessmen in Connecticut apparently think the ECA is just another government purchasing agency," reported Thomas J. Radewich, commercial and foreign trade official in the Hartford office.

Doors Little Purchasing  
"This isn't true," he added. "The ECA does a very small proportion of the buying under the Marshall plan, and what it does is limited mainly to grains and foodstuffs."

"All business deals are completed by the businessmen themselves," he stated. "Usually, this is done through a foreign agency located in New York or Washington."

Un-American Evening

The challenge of whether or not this shall remain America, or whether it shall merely become the reverse side of the Russian Communist coin, was sharply posed by developments over at Newhall, Saturday night, when what had been announced as a "peaceable" demonstration against an outdoor concert by Paul Robeson turned into an evening of violence which police, although they might have expected it, did not expect to see.

The New York Times this morning has this to say of the incident: "It may be hard to determine who started the slugging, but it seems certain that the audience went there to hear Mr. Robeson sing, not to get into a fight. Mr. Robeson, whatever his other qualities, is one of this generation's most magnificent singers."

The demonstrators took the position, as near as one can tell, that because Mr. Robeson is enthusiastic about Communism, Russia and because his concert was to be under the auspices of an organization led by former Attorney General Tom Clark as "subversive" he ought not be allowed to sing. It is true that Mr. Robeson, a man of strong emotion, who has seemed to be the friend of the unfortunate and oppressed, has recently added with the oppressors who now rule Russia. His heart is probably still in the right place, but not much can be said for his logic. But what has this got to do with his right to sing? Or if a man can be enjoined from singing in public in this free country because his opinions are wrong and illogical shall the injunction be enforced by mob action?

"We think these questions answer themselves," concluded The New York Times. "Lamenting the twisted thinking that is ruining Paul Robeson's great career, we defend his right to carry his art to whatever peaceably assembled groups of people he wishes. That is the American way."

In the Russia to which Mr. Robeson is so flattering in his public comments, the right to practice any art is indeed entirely conditional upon the artist's complete acceptance of the official politics of that country. Revolts That Failed: The Communists are past masters of the technique of self-

ness through accusation of others, and they have finally evolved, with the help of their Czechoslovakian underlings, their own answer to the old, but still rankling rhetorical fact of the Warsaw revolt.

That revolt inside Warsaw, which occurred after the Red Army was positioned close to the city in its pursuit of the Germans across Poland, was successfully and bloodily crushed by the Nazis. The Poles who took part in it had begun with the assumption that they would have the active support of the Red Army and the Russian Air Force. No such aid of any kind was forthcoming for them. Furthermore, the Russians turned down suggestions that they should assist the American bombers to assist the revolt against the Nazis by dropping supplies.

The Red Army seemed to pass up the city while the revolt was being smothered. Ever since, the inference of the West has been that Russia was losing the war, and that it doomed the abortive Warsaw revolt to failure because it feared success for the revolt might put non-Communist Poles in victorious possession of Warsaw.

Now, at long last, the Communists have produced their counter-defense. It is the story to the effect that the western allies, back in 1944, deliberately sabotaged another premature revolt by developing over at Newhall, Saturday night, when what had been announced as a "peaceable" demonstration against an outdoor concert by Paul Robeson turned into an evening of violence which police, although they might have expected it, did not expect to see.

This is a short-lived story, even though it is true that the West too was guilty of playing politics even during the war, as when Churchill and Stalin split up the Balkans between themselves, with results neither have since liked. But this particular story lives only so long as it takes to remember the documented proof of how the American Army halted just inside the hot zone of Czechoslovakia, at the request of the Russians, so that the Red Army could have the honor and the glory of liberating that country, even though that might mean that the Czechoslovak people would have some dangerous delay in their liberation.

Each side of the war-time coalition were naturally tempted to post-war power politics aims, but it is on the record that we accumulated to that temptation much less than did Russia.

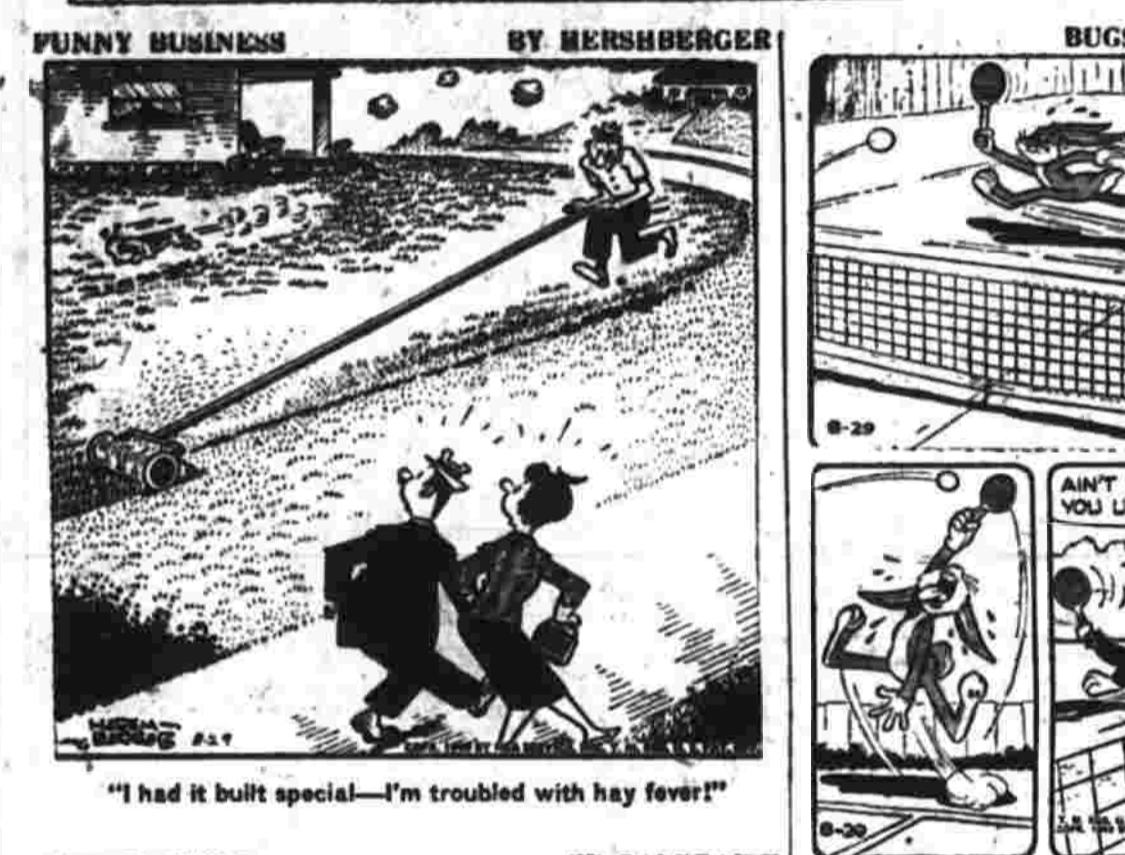
