Court Officials Jail Visitors

The Hartford County Jail is highly overcrowded, suffers a lack of "social and spiritual guidance" and has only confinement to offer to its inmates, Judge Wesley C. Gryk stated today.
Judge Gryk and Probation Officer Harold Keating were among a group of court officials from Hartford County who made a tour of the jail yesterday. Judge Gryk inspected the tour as a favor that would aid in rendering court decisions. The officials were shown through the prison by Jailor James R. Ellsworth, sheriff of Hartford County, and Deputy Jailor Fellagrina.
Judge Gryk deplored the crowded conditions at the jail. Although the jail has a capacity of 300 prisoners, he said, the institution had 538 inmates yesterday. The future doesn't look too bright either, according to Gryk. "There were 4,500 admissions to the jail last year and 8,000 admissions are expected this year."
Noting that there is no rehabilitation program for inmates, about 80 per cent of whom are

committed for intoxication, Judge Gryk said that the prisoners are "thrown out on society" in the same way that they are thrown in. The process represents a waste of money by society, since many of the inmates are continuously being recommitted.
The crowded conditions often make it necessary for two men to share a one-man cell, he said. Such a situation exists on the third tier of cells, added Judge Gryk, where each cell is equipped with a cot, a mattress spread on the floor, and a stool.
"In these cells there is hardly room for a man to stand, in order to provide more room, some of the mattresses under the cots and that is the way they sleep, in much the same manner that a dog lays under his master's bed. Only the trustees' mattresses have sheets."
There are no automatic toilet facilities in the cells, said Gryk, and metal buckets are used instead. These buckets are emptied and disinfected every day. Toilet facilities which are used by the inmates are contained in Gryk, and although a new cell block has provision for toilets none have been installed.
Commenting on the lack of any

rehabilitation program, Judge Gryk pointed out that there is no definite waste of manpower. "The hardest work to be found in the jail is that of emptying the buckets," said a representative of the Alcoholics Anonymous organization. During the week, there is one man at the jail whose duties are similar to those of a custodian, and he advises the inmates on personal and family difficulties.
"I should think some social service or religious organization would find the County Jail a very fertile field for guidance," suggested Gryk.
Although the great majority of inmates are alcoholics or drunkards, there is no program to help these people, said Gryk. A large "recreation room" offers reading material and card playing, but not much more, he said.
The average cost for food is 72 cents per day for each inmate, Judge Gryk said that no one seemed to know the cost of keeping an inmate for one day.
Foster Farm System
Both Ellsworth and Fellagrina told Gryk that they thought some kind of farm system for the inmates would be beneficial.
Cooking is done by a prison guard, usually, assisted by the inmates. No cook is employed by the jail.

He said that state institutions have more opportunities for work. Inmates can build benches for parks. Inmates cannot earn any money and are allowed one dollar a week from the County Jail. He said that any, for the purchase of candy or cigarettes, said Gryk.
Judge Gryk stated that the other court officials who toured the jail yesterday agreed that the conditions were far from favorable.

Expansion at UConn Changes Appearance

Starts Aug. 30—Old as well as new students will have to learn their way around when the University of Connecticut begins its new school year next month. A big expansion program pushed during the summer months has made many changes in the university's physical appearance.

At least ten new buildings will be ready for use with the start of the new semester. Several other structures are close to completion.

Horsesham hill, for example, has just much of the pastoral atmosphere. University horses used once grazed there. Now it is the site for four buildings.

One of the new buildings there is the central section of the College of Agriculture building. Dean C. B. Gentry said it will be ready by Sept. 15.

Eventually, two wings will be added to the building.

Horsesham hill also is the site for the Ralston Hicks School of Agriculture building expected to be completed possibly by Dec. 15, and two dormitories for men, most of whom will be agriculture students.

Last year's students were familiar with the settlement commonly known as "North campus," a series of eight dormitories named for the eight Connecticut counties. The dormitories are laid out in a way that the second floor of the foremost dorm is level with the first floor of the dormitory in back of it.

These eight dormitories form a court, with four dormitories on each side, and were put into use last spring.

Returning students will find three more dormitories built in the same manner and bearing the names of Hurley, Baldwin and McCaughy halls in honor of three former governors of Connecticut. It is expected that the new dormitories will be finished by September 15.

McCaughey hall, the dormitory which closes the court, consists of a dining hall two stories high, and a post house which probably will be used for bachelor faculty quarters.

The dining hall will serve approximately 1,800 students with two cafeteria lines running simultaneously.

In this same area, are located seven dormitories which will house the campus fraternities.

All of the north campus buildings are being constructed by the Gilbane Construction Company of Providence. Gilbane is using a newly developed process of pre-cast slabs of concrete. A red brick veneer provides an attractive finish for the buildings.

This "North campus" section of the campus will house approximately 2,500 students in 14 buildings.

The new solid house back of the main hall will not be fully completed by the opening of school. Offices to be used by the Physical Education department will be ready, however. The main floor and vast swimming pool will not be ready for student use at that time.

Dean Gentry reports that the faculty housing which will house 71 families may be completed in 17 buildings which will be ready by the start of the new semester.

Also nearing completion are the new infirmary, and the annex to the Atwater laboratory.

The biggest shock to students will be Beach hall, formerly the university administration and science building.

Students wishing to pay their fee bills will find that nearly all the doors on the first two floors of Beach hall have been changed to new signs on them saying "Moved."

President Jorgensen and his office are now occupying the old brewing room in the Wilbur Cross library. Dean Gentry and Dean A. E. Waugh are sharing quarters in Gully hall.

The registrars office, the recording office and the admissions office have all moved to the basement of the library in a room which was formerly a study and reading room for students.

Placement, housing and veterans' offices have been moved to Haller armory and nearly all other offices have gone to various buildings in south campus.

Most of the offices are only temporary until other facilities become available.

Beach hall now has very few walls in it, and is being completely renovated. This building, in the future, will be used entirely for scientific courses which have laboratory work.

Another big surprise will come to the student body when the new buildings are also being converted into classrooms and offices.

When those buildings are ready, all classes will be centralized in the middle of the campus.

"South campus" classrooms will be no more.

Construction of seven women's dormitories will begin in the fall but these will not be ready for another year. Planned also are a student union building, an auditorium, an administration building, and a Pharmacy building.

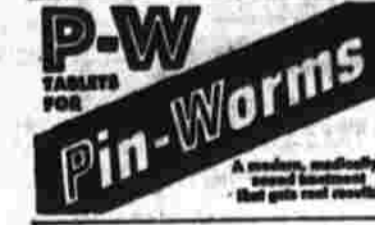
Squires to Note 5th Anniversary
