Robeson, announcing his new concert at a New York meeting, said:

"I wish the state troopers show up, we'll be protected, we'll be there, they will have a concert with many artists from all over the United States."

The veterans groups met in Cortland township, where the concert is scheduled, to draw up plans for their parade.

Alan M. Grant, Jr., supervisor of the town, said a parade permit was granted to the veterans—comprising 14 posts of various organizations—last night.

A spokesman for the veterans said nine Westchester Legion posts, three Veterans of Foreign Wars groups and one Catholic War Veterans and one Jewish War Veterans post will be represented.

Expect Long Parade The parade, the spokesman said, will go down Hillsdale avenue, which runs past the golf course grounds. He said the groups hope to stage a parade "five or 10 miles long."

The spokesman said a committee of 14 is in charge of the parade, but declined to give their names. He said the committee will report tomorrow to Westchester County District Attorney George F. Farnell.

Farnell, the spokesman said, told the veterans in a message last night that "we will take every precaution to prevent any disturbances."

The district attorney and other Westchester law officials are probing last Saturday's riot on orders from Gov. Thomas E. Dewey.

Will Provide Protection Westchester County Sheriff Fred W. Ruocco has said his office would provide adequate protection for any future Robeson concert if asked to do so by the sponsor.

As far as could be learned last night, no such request had been made.

The Albany demonstration, sponsored by the Civil Rights congress, listed as a subcommittee by the justice department, marched in Albany to demand further state investigation of last week-end's disorder.

The group of 11 persons was hooded by a crowd and police authorities ordered the demonstration halted to prevent possible disturbances.

Two Persons Die in Blaze

Fairfield Father Apparently Makes Vain Effort to Rescue Son

Fairfield, Sept. 2.—Two persons died, a father apparently in a vain effort to save his son, and six persons were injured early today when fire swept through a dwelling on Kings highway.

The bodies of Stephen Gollas, 45, and his 14-year-old son, Charles, were found in the home, the father on a staircase leading to a bedroom where his son's body lay.

Taken to Bridgeport hospital was another son, Stephen Gollas, 18; Frank Gollas, 70, father and grandfather of the two who died.

John Gollas, 42, a son of Frank, Michael Nemes, 29, his wife, Matilda, 26, and their 10-month-old son, Michael, Jr., Bridgeport and St. Vincent's hospitals reported the six all were in fair condition.

Baby Taken From Window Second John Gollas, from a second story window by his mother, suffered burns on the arms in the fire. Mrs. Matilda Nemes, a daughter of Frank Gollas, suffered a broken right ankle and burns on the face, arms, back and chest.

Her husband and Stephen Gollas both suffered burns on the hands, face and back.

John Gollas was burned on the face and suffered a broken right wrist and a fractured rib. He was seriously, but suffered a broken face and back.

Tots Smother Inside Cooler
