



Sharp Drop

The drop in reservoir capacities since May, as shown by the water department grapha, has been very abrupt, and it is said that over a week of heavy soaking rain would be required to show any appreciable result in the storage levels.

Of interest are the rainfall graphs in the water department, kept since 1897. These show some interesting facts.

One of them is that, over the period 1897 to 1942 the rainfall was 44.16 inches on an average per year. But taking in the period 1897 to 1946 the average dropped to 43.69 inches, and is still going down on the basis of the period 1897 to 1950. While individual yearly rainfall has followed no pattern of a continual decline, but has both ups and downs, the figures do show, Mr. Thrall says, that we are in a period of decreasing rainfall.

This does not indicate that Manchester may someday be the center of a great desert, for the swing back to wetter years usually follows dry ones.
