



Attorney Garrity said the arguments of a reduction in the square foot minimum in A zones would have to be advertised and heard by the proper zoning authorities for legal consideration, the attuation provoked a mild attack by Arthur Knoffa and Allen who noted that the request for a flearing, filed some months ago "should by this time have been acted on so there would be no delay". On the whole, the exchanges and discussion were restrained, and constructive criticism and questioning filled in the more than two hours in which the hearing was carried on.

At the outset, Judge John D. LaBelle and Altorney Garrity, both representing clients amongst the real estate people present, stated their position in regard to the five articles in the petition.

Briefly, the petition requests the following: that instead of requiring a graded grayelled or trap rock ballasted road, paved with a top coating of tar or asphalt, all installed at the developer's cost, the requirement as to tar or asphalt be cut, the town to put on this top dressing. This, it was claimed, would save the developer \$56 on a 70 foot lot.

second, where now the rules require that curbs and sidewalks be installed by the developer, it was asked that such installation be left entirely at the option of the future home owners. It was claimed that much of the new type of ranch house building is not of a sort to require either walks or curbs, which, in fact, were said to be a detriment in many outlying rural areas.

As another part of this section, it was asked that the requirement that a developer post a surety bond insuring that he will install such walks and curbs within a certain time be cast out. Instead, it was suggested that a caveat might be put on the land records as a notice to the purchasing public of the development situation.

Third, the resitors asked that when storm water sewers are installed, a developer be assessed only such cost as may arise from the actual drainage of waters originating on his tract; that any inflowing accumulation be ascertained, and that such extra pipe as may be required to tare for this outside accumulation be proportionately placed on those property owners, or on the town, where the water does not originate.

State Housing Roofers Forget to Put Back House's Chimney Rents Slashed

The reductions, ranging from \$6.50 to \$12 monthly, were announced by Gov. Chester Bowles yesterday in behalf of local housing authorities in the seven communities—New Haven, Waterbury, Middletown, Meriden, Wethermfield, Willimantic and Southington.

A total of \$35 dwelling units aiready built or under construction are affected by the reductions. Of them, \$12 are now occupied and 126 are reported as ready for occupany.

"I'm pleased and gratified to be
able to approve and report these
significant reductions" said Governor Bowles, "They are the first
of many steps in our long fight to
get low-cost housing to people who
have been longest and hardest hit
by Connecticut's severe housing
abortage."

The reductions affect so-called
"shelter rents" only. On top of
these charges for bare accommo
dations, tenants must pay for the
coast of heat, water and other utilfiles.

Three factors made the reductions possible, Governor Bowles
said, Hating them as:

1. The abort term loan provisions of the new housing program.
2. The drop in building costs
over the past year.

3. Local tax remissions.
