Rocket Launching Bases of Reds All Over East Europe

Reliable Sources in Germany Assert Nazi-Built Munitions Factories Producing Missiles for Russians; Bases Aimed at West

Berlin, Sept. 25.—(AP)—Russia has dotted eastern Europe with launching bases for deadlier rockets than Hitler ever used in World War II, German and American sources said today. Reliable sources said at least the Nazi-built munitions plant in Soviet-occupied Germany producing rockets for Russia. The exact location of the Soviet launching bases is not known. But allied military intelligence officers said they believed Russia had constructed a chain of them—aimed at western Europe—stretching from the Baltic to the Black sea in Soviet satellite territories.

Bumper Grain Crop Looming

Europe Expects Yield Of Wheat Close to That of Pre-War Years

Paris, Sept. 25.—(AP)—Europe looks forward to a bumper 1949 wheat crop, approaching the yield of pre-war years. An Associated Press correspondent said that the harvest will be 14 percent above last year's crop, despite long summer droughts. Only two European countries were included in the survey, because most other nations have made it a crime to disclose crop estimates. "Earlier this summer," one American expert here said, "we figured this year's crop probably five per cent below last year's. The figures coming in now make us think that it may be even better than 1947."

**Boy Is Held For Murder**  
Bay State Youth Admits Shooting Father While He Sleeps  
Sittate, Mass., Sept. 25.—(AP)—A 17-year-old boy who admitted shooting his father while he slept in a rooming house, was held today on a charge of murder.  
Sittate Police Chief William Kane said Francis Whorl, a high school sophomore, told investigators he shot his father while the man slept Saturday night.  
The body of Kenneth Whorl, 46, an employee of the Sittate Highway department, was found early Monday after Kane said the boy woke his mother and told her he had done a terrible thing.  
State Police Detective Inspector Norman C. Butler said Francis gave this account:  
"The boy found a .32 caliber revolver in the home of Mrs. Alice Whorl, his mother and the wife of his father, Francis, who was sleeping at the time."  
He loaded the gun, fired a practice shot in woods and then hid the weapon in a dresser drawer in his own home.  
He later returned, got the gun, went to his father's bedroom and shot him as he slept.  
The boy went back to the Whorl home intending to commit suicide but changed his mind. He unlocked the gun, then threw away the discharged shells, pocketed the four live ones and went to bed.

A growing majority of our newspaper publishers have come to realize that running a modern newspaper means that the public interest must be placed before immediate profit."
