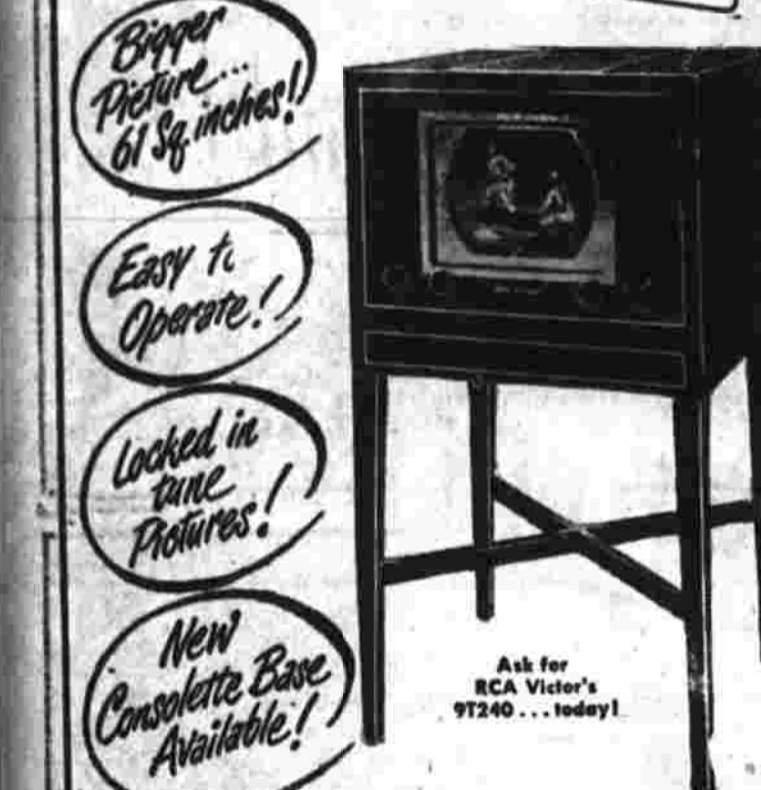

Usual Paragraph

Occasionally we like to make a clinical study of how the American press handles a story. There were several interesting things about the story, the other day, which we on the Herald carried under the headline, "Rocket Launching Bases of Reds All Over East Europe."

Obviously this was a story, presumably founded on factual reports, although their sources could not be revealed, and one of the most threatening in the world. Coming on top of the disclosure that Russia has the atomic bomb, its main text was one creating fear of Russia.

But this news story, for a typical "alarm" story, had one most unusual paragraph. It read, in the Herald, as follows:

"A U. S. Army source said: 'The phony news item, which has been a network of launching bases for rockets. We know Russia sincerely fears an attack from the East, and that rockets are a basic defense weapon of modern warfare.'"

This is a most unusual paragraph because American news services, in stories of this kind, usually make any kind of point of presenting the "other side" of the story for what it may be worth. We Americans might have a much sadder view of the world if this sort of thing were done more often. But normally the account in American news is on one side, and anything that might diminish this alarm is not written.

In this case it was written, and in the Herald it was carried as it was written.

In some other newspapers which carried the same story, from the same copy, the section of the story containing the particular paragraph was eliminated, presumably because the story was being cut down to fit into a certain amount of space. Or it may have been, in some instances, that the editors handling the story recognized the fact that this paragraph tamed the story down too much, by allowing the Russians to appear a little less villainous.

Whatever the reason some newspapers did not use the paragraph in question, the Associated Press itself, rewriting the same story for its service to morning newspapers, seemed to use the paragraph in full, and the statement by the "U. S. Army source" was dropped out of the new story.

The new story, in turn, was headed by a new lead, which told the world that it was German scientists who were producing for the Russians the long range rockets which would be used in the launching sites previously disclosed.

Here the news service was back in form. Here were the villainous Russians using villainous Nazi rockets, another good alarm story.

There was one intelligent and fair addition which could have been made to the story. But, since it would have clouded the picture of Russian villainy, it was not present. Perhaps it never suggested itself to the men writing the story. But a real American news story, concerned with presenting all the truth, and not just part of the truth, would have included this other fact. It was the fact that the United States itself has imported scores of Nazi rocket scientists and has been employing them ever since the war in its own effort to produce long range rockets.

In the first instance, the news service sent out a whole story, which is what good news service should do whenever it is possible. In the second instance, the same news service sent out three-quarters of a news story. The story told no untruth, but it did still present one set of facts, letting them create their impression, without altering in other facts which might bring that impression somewhat. This is the precise thing which is the most frequent flaw in what is unquestionably the best and fairest press in the world. The responsible American press does not print deliberate lies. It guards itself against all obvious propaganda. But it is still weak in its weighting of the facts it reports, and it is all too often guilty of the negative sin of omission of facts which would be pertinent. The fact that the press is weak in this respect is the very thing which we quoted in the original story was so unusual a paragraph, so much news in itself, illustrated our point.

Security by the Martin-McMahon route is an impossibility. It is not guaranteed by the "Point Four" route, but that route does at least offer a positive chance.
