



Is 12 Years Old

Little League baseball was founded 12 years ago by Carl Stotz in the city of Williamsport, Pa. Stots had two nephews who liked to play baseball but were stumped by the man-sized game, explained O'Rourke. So Stotz went out and found a softball diamond

out and found a softball diamond—and the Little League was born.
Today, everything in the league must be official. There are specifications for equipment, diamond and field dimensions and the eligibility of players. Only youngsters between the ages of eight and 12 can play in the Little League.

Bats must be between 28 and 33 inches in length with a barrel no thicker than 2% inches in diamenter. Before each league tournament, all bats are checked with

nament, all bats are checked with a metal ring of the exact diameter, said O'Rourke.

Additional Betalla

The official LL ball is nine inches in circumference and weighs five ounces. The pitcher's mound is 40 feet, four inches from the plate, and the diamond is two thirds of the major league size. Softball bases are used to cut down the possibility of injury. O'Rourke displayed a black, all-rubber sneaker that may be inrubber sneaker that may be in-cluded as standard league equip-ment. The low-cut sneaker has a hard toe and rubber spikes. Each playing field is enclosed by a fence, built in an approximate 180 foot arc from home plate. Each league is comprised of four teams, explained the speaker, and each team has 12 completely uniformed players. Each LL player is insured up to \$500 for each acci-

dent. O'Rourke estimated that it would cost between \$800 and \$1,-290 to start a league. After that, he added, they are self-supporti 14 Leagues in State Commissioner O'Rourke pointed out-that in 1948 there was but one mer, he said, 14 leagues were op-erating and it is hoped that over 50 leagues will be operating in the state in 1950.

The easiest part in starting a league is the financing of the pro-ject, said the speaker. The most difficulty is encountered in getting ecticut. Last su

The league must be run on a community basis with all services, umpiring for example, being do-nated, he said.

The Middletown LL tournament this year drew 20,000 people and contributions of \$1,900 were obcontributions of \$1,900 were obtained, said the speaker. The national tournament, made up of the various state champions, was held in Williamsport and drew 45,000 people in four days. O'Rourke stated that the opening game found 9,500 people on hand while 12,000 spectators witnessed the final game of the series.

The expenses of the competing teams were paid by the United States Rubber company. Broadcasting of the game was handled by Ted Husing, and notables who attended the LL "world series" included Ford Frick and Harry

Grayson.
