Intent to Murder Charge Is Faced

Lawrence, Mass. Oct. 5—(AP)—

A 50-year-old Lawrence businessman was held today for arraignment on a charge of assault with intent to murder his business partner during a highway shooting. Joseph Cutili was booked several hours after Thomas J. Bonaccorsi, 45, was killed yesterday by several shots at a highway intersection in nearby Methuen. The men are cigar dealers. Police Capt. Francis J. Trayner said Cutili came to his home to surrender. Earlier, Filippo Butta, 58, of Andover, a friend of both men, was arrested. He was booked on charges of attempt to murder, assault with a dangerous weapon, and with being an accessory before the fact. Trayner said the charges against Butta still stand. He indicated, however, that they may be reduced later to the necessary counts. Trayner noted Cutili as saying he shot Bonaccorsi in self-defense after the latter had slapped him in the face while they were riding in his car.

Mulvihill Urges Turning On Auto Lights at Dusk

That Light Be Turned On During Dusk Hours

Hartford, Oct. 5—(AP)—Dusk is an "extremely dangerous hour" to be driving without lights. Automobile accidents killed three persons and injured approximately 427 others during dusk hours in Connecticut last year. State Motor Vehicle Commissioner Cornelius F. Mulvihill told about the deaths and injuries in a reminder to Connecticut motorists today that a state law requires that lights be turned on during dusk hours. "A state law requires lights at least one half hour before sunrise or after sunset," the commissioner said. "Dusk is an extremely dangerous hour, because pedestrians and motor vehicles often are little more than shadows on poorly lighted roads at that time," Commissioner Mulvihill stated. True Bills Returned by Grand Jury in Slaying at Greenwich

Bridgewater, Oct. 5—(AP)—Two ex-convicts accused of slaying a night watchman during an attempted burglary at the Indian Harbor Yacht club, Greenwich, were indicted on first degree murder charges here yesterday. True bills against Frank C. Smith, 23, of Newton, and George J. Lowden, 22, of Stamford, were returned by a superior court grand jury which, for the first time in the history of Fairfield county, included women in the panel. State's Attorney Louis W. Willis said the defendants will be arraigned tomorrow. At that time they will be given a choice of being tried by a jury or a panel of three superior court judges. The state charges that Smith and Lowden shot and fatally wounded Grover S. Hartz, 68, when he surprised them in the Greenwich Yacht club last summer. He then was working as a taxi-driver, and living with a woman and their son on Staten Island, although he also has a pre-war wife and two children in Waterbury, Conn.

Oakville Bartender Witness

Also testifying for the prosecution was an Oakville, Conn., bartender, Peter R. Ricci, who lives at 71 Wood street, Waterbury, Conn.

Ricci said he saw Martino in May, 1945, near the Oakville bar and "I could not believe it was he, but it was and I went over."

"He acted very, very strange," Ricci said. "I was probably more surprised than any one else, I believed he was dead."

Ricci said Martino told him then that he planned to give himself up to the Army, and asked Ricci not to say anything "until he cleared himself."

On occasion, Ricci said he saw Martino but he couldn't swear it was Martino he saw, and added: "His brother looks more like he used to than he does now."

Seen On Transport

The Army introduced a deposition by John Sutherland of Boston, Mass., saying he had seen Martino and Caswell in 1944 aboard the Army transport on which Caswell testified the two returned as stowaways.

"I remember Martino telling me they would rather die than go back," Sutherland's deposition said.

Martino's lawyer introduced another statement, allegedly made later by Sutherland, in which he was quoted as saying he met Caswell and a soldier who "resembled Martino" in France.

"On the ship, the statement quoted Sutherland, 'I never saw Martino but I knew there were two stowaways and I took it for granted that he was Martino because he looked like the ship with Caswell'."

That far President Truman has kept hands off the inter-service row. But there were indications he was keeping in close touch with developments.

The schedule of his appointments for today included an afternoon call from Secretary of Defense Johnson and Secretary of the Navy Matthews. The White House declined to say beforehand whether it was for the purpose of going over the inter-service row.

The House committee, in recommending the firing of Worth, approved only one section of a tentative draft of its report on the B-36 investigation. It will act on other sections before making the report public.

The section approved said the evidence shows that charges of favoritism and other irregularities in the B-36 program were based mainly on "rumor, rumor and imagination" and have been proven on "to be false."

It added that many of the charges were "the figment of Worth's imagination."
