





To provide funds for the expansion of school buildings, various suggestions have been offered. Some favor raising the necessary money out of taxation; some wish a state bond issue; others believe that local bond issue; others believe that local bond issue of repayment, would answer the purpose.

It is on the means of financing the local school system expansions that most differences arise, for very few, according to the state report, differ in the view that the conditions call for prompt action.

Some of the facts revealed by the report follow: there are still 55 one room schools in use in the state, and out of the 850 school buildings in use in the past year more than half were erected prior to 1921. Of the total 271 were erected before 1905 and 173 were built before 1891.


