Dental Atom Makes Teeth Radioactive

By NEA Bervice Palm Springs, Calif.-(NEA)in wider, please. Here comes lentist with a Geiger counter. But it won't hurt a bit. He's not going to drill with it, and he oean't suspect you of hiding an atom bomb in your molars. He just wants to see where the

The Geiger counter, which measure radioactivity, is being teamed up with radioactive isoteamed up with radioactive incomes as a new "eye" for the den-tal profession in its fight to com-bat tooth decay.

Dr. Harold Copp, a radiation specialist, has been collaborating with the College of Dentistry at the University of California to put the by-products of the atomic age to work for your aching teeth. He'll show how it works at a seminar for 150 of the nation's medical-dental researchers and practitioners, being held at Paim Springs this week. One way atomic energy is helping the dentist in clinical tests rine on tooth enamel. Fluorine is



And that dot is being used by the United States Coast and Goedetic Survey to measure the size and shape of the earth. The current project is the sec-ond phase of the job. Last year, astronomical calculations were made by geodetic survey officials. This year they are making grav-ity checks, centering around the rock on Robinson's farm. 
