

Board to Fill Two Vacancies
Directors to Act on Holman's Resignation; Another's Term Ends

At least one, and possibly two new members of the Town Planning Commission seem likely to be named in the coming week. The directors will meet tomorrow night for their first regular November session. The board will act on, and presumably accept, the resignation of Charles W. Holman, present chairman and identified, with zoning since the inception of the commission here. Mr. Holman, who has previously asked for release from the duties, now has made it plain that he desires to retire.

The second vacancy will occur at the expiration of the term of the Planning Commission of Henry D. Griswold, who has also previously asked for release from the duties, now has made it plain that he desires to retire.

But two years ago a battle developed over the tenure of Griswold, who was criticized because he held a town office which otherwise caused him to pass on his own work as a private civil engineer.

Threatened to Resign
The board of directors went so far as to require Griswold's resignation. Then Mr. Holman stated that he would quit if Griswold was forced out. Holman held that the directors' action was, in effect, a vote of lack of confidence in the integrity of the Planning Commission. Finally, it was determined that the directors had no legal right to demand Griswold's resignation and that he would be able to continue to hold his office until the expiration of his term.

Other Vacancies
Besides the vacancies on the Planning Commission, an appointment is due on the Zoning Board of Appeals where the term of the chairman, Martin Alford expires.

On the Library Board terms of Leon Thorp and Emily G. Chesney expire on the 31st of this month.

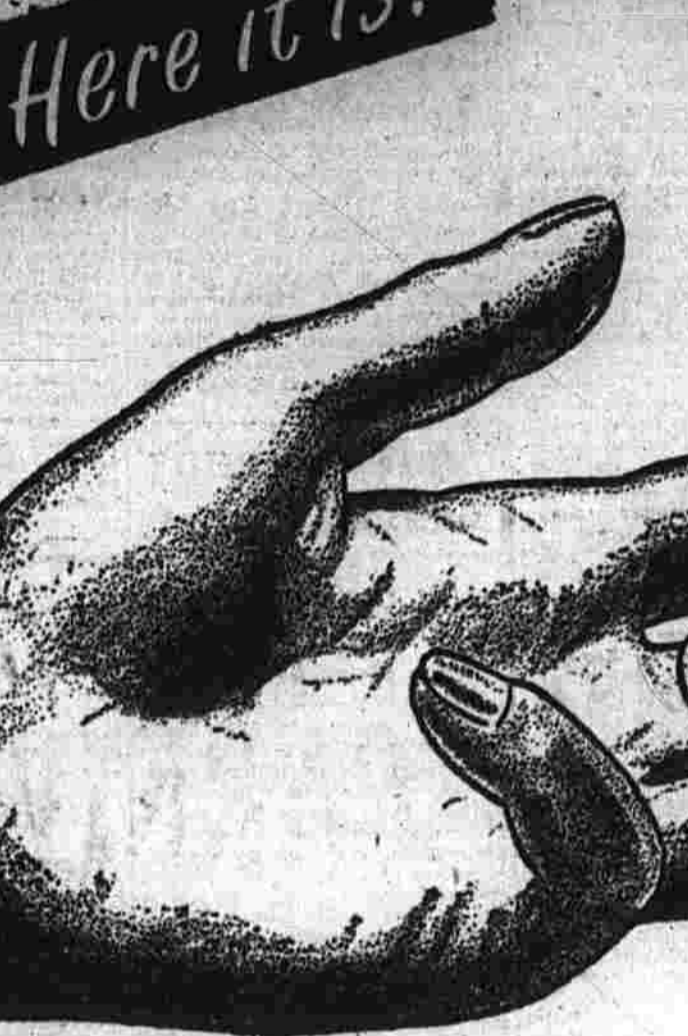
