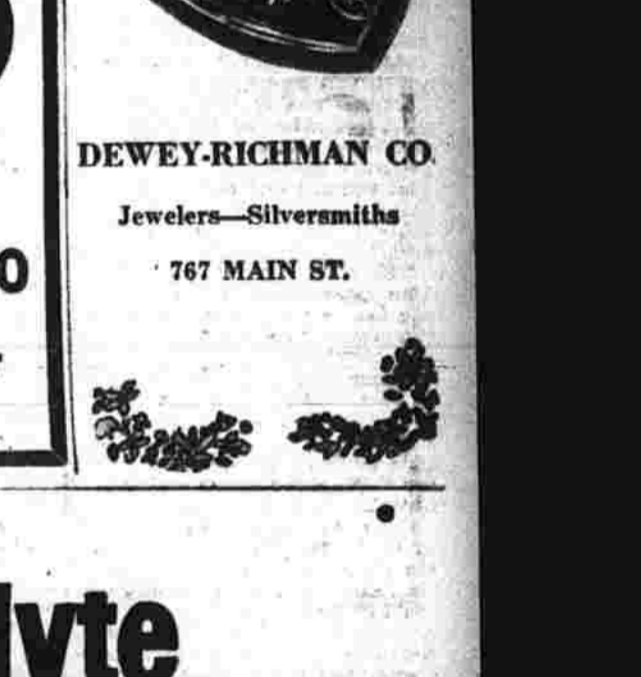

Bowles Gives Answer On His Fiscal Policies

Replies to Republican Criticism Today; Asks Start on Building of Schools in State

Hartford, Nov. 1.—Gov. Bowles today gave his answer to the Republican criticism of his fiscal policies and asked that "we stop building financial smokescreens and start building schools in this state."

The reply followed a week-end attack by the governor on the fiscal policies of the Republican administration of Gov. Raymond E. Baldwin. Bowles said that his fiscal policies were based on the principle of "no new taxes" and that he had no intention of increasing the tax burden on the people.

He also announced that he had signed a bill providing for the construction of 100 new school buildings in the state over the next two years. Bowles said that this was a major step toward improving the state's educational system.

Other steel firms, Bethlehem has been financing a pension system for 20 years but at a lower rate providing for about \$10 a month. On social insurance—death, sickness, accidents, hospitalization—employees get 2 1/2 cents an hour into a fund and the company matches it.
