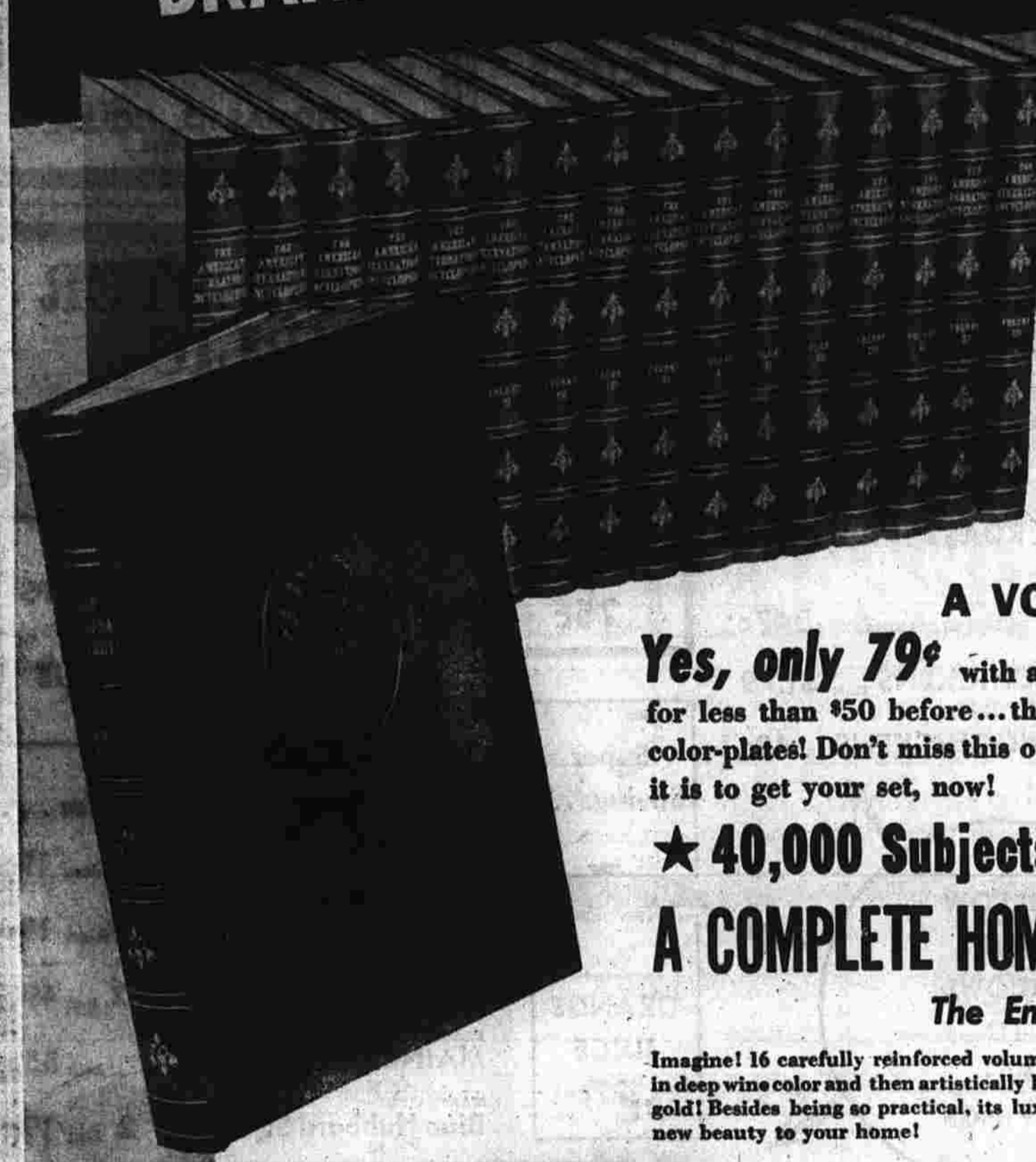

Cardinal Marzulli, elevated to the Sacred College in 1935, was prefect of the Congregation for the Council. He directed the application and enforcement of degrees of the Council of Trent and other church laws.

His death reduces the membership of the College of Cardinals to 54. The full membership is 70. Funeral services will be held Monday at St. Cecilia's church in Rome, at which Cardinal Marzulli was titular head. Burial will be at Rome's Verano cemetery.

Wallingford, Nov. 3.—Dr. Philip Young, dean of the Graduate School of Business at Columbia University, has been elected to the Board of Trustees of the Chateau school, private preparatory school for boys here. Young was a deputy land-use administrator during World War II and has held several other Federal posts.

Clairton, Pa., Nov. 3.—Clairton's city fathers have set up a relief fund for the families of the town's 6,000 striking steelworkers. At a special session yesterday, city Council voted unanimously to appropriate \$50,000 as an emergency relief fund. The program will start on Monday.

Governor Details Further Matters He Views Urgent

Hartford, Nov. 4.—(AP)—Governor Bowles today detailed the "additional matters" he claims are in urgent need of legislative action.
