Quito, Ecuador, Nov. 4.—(AP)—Ecuador's President Galo Plaza Lasso is alive today because assassins failed to kill him in a matter of minutes when he would cross a bridge.

The government, claiming last night that an attempt had been made on his life, gave this account of the incident:

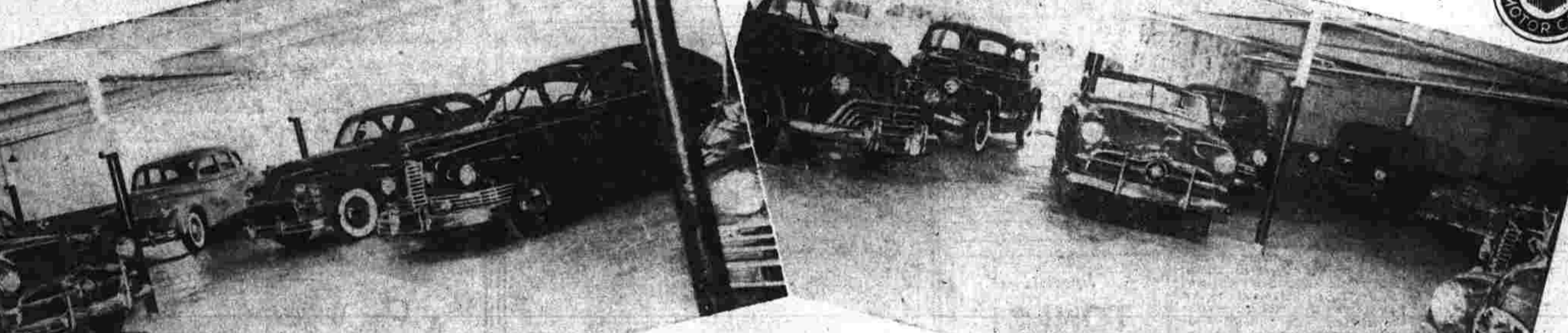

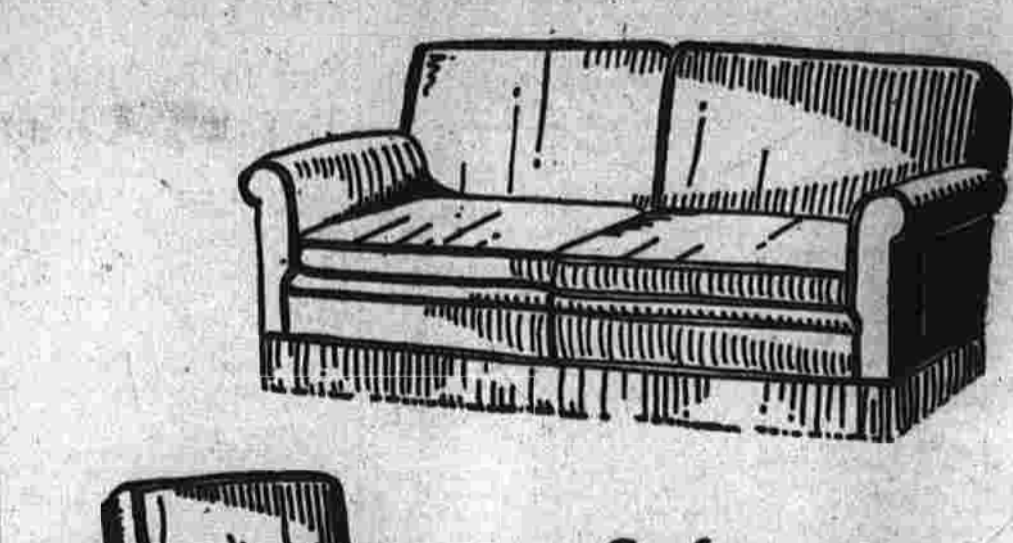
It is sad enough to have the West and the East engaged in a friendship of the affection and the friendship of the defeated enemy. That alone, if it continues, is certain to produce a condition in which the Germans successfully play one side against the other, and re-emerge themselves as a new balance of power in Europe or even as a new threat to the peace of Europe and the world.

But the West itself is divided on what policies to pursue in its own section of Germany. It is divided between instincts to build Germany up and keep it down. On the one hand, it is encouraging German industrial production. On the other, it is still dismantling plants. On the one hand, it is encouraging Germany to export. On the other hand, it fears the competition of such German exports. On the one hand, it wants to aid Western Germany to the point of nationhood. 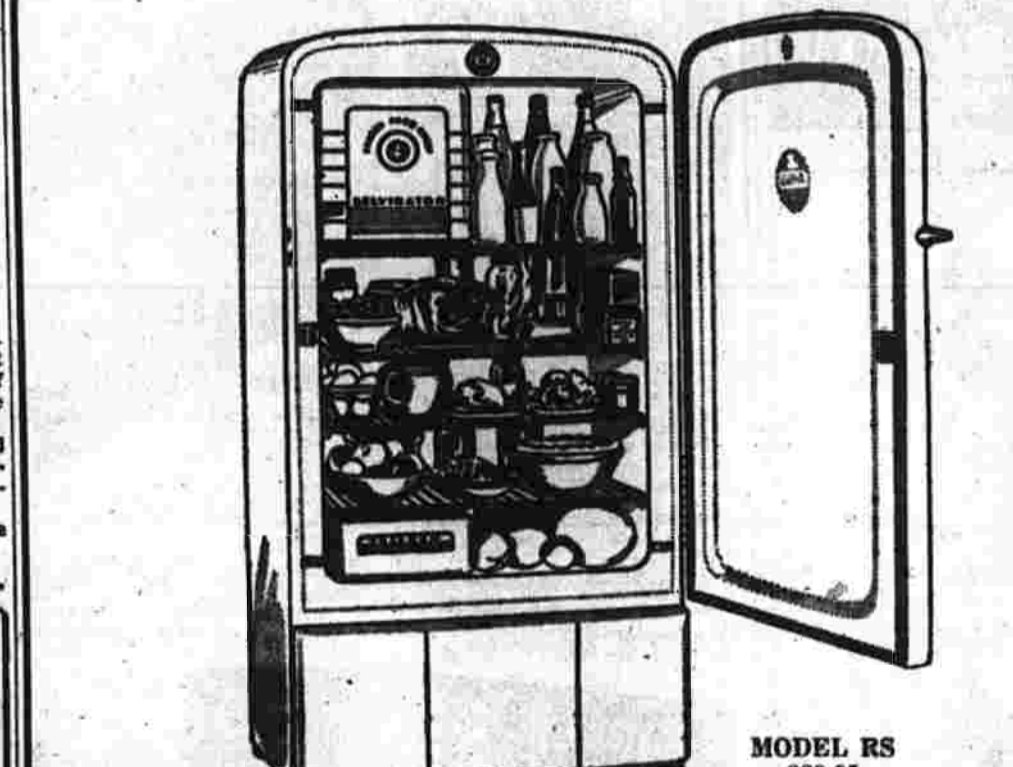
