Lowden Given Life Sentence
Pleads Guilty to Second Degree Murder in Fatal Shooting
Bridgeport, Nov. 5.—(Special)—With his life at stake, George F. Lowden emphatically made his first-degree murder trial last yesterday by pleading guilty to the lesser charge of second degree murder.
The 22-year-old accountant from Plainfield thus admitted his implication in the fatal shooting of Edward J. Hart, 48, a night watchman at the Indian Harbor Yacht Club in Greenwich.
Impose Mandatory Sentence
Immediately after accepting the plea, Judge Edward J. Quinn imposed the mandatory sentence of life imprisonment, and Lowden was taken to Wethersfield to be confined in the state prison.
The state will next proceed against Frank C. Smith, 33, of North Plainfield, who was indicted for the same crime as Lowden in an attempted burglary at the yacht club the night Hart was killed last July. Hart was serving life electric chair, mandatory sentence for a 22 caliber pistol robbery.
