Stockton, Calif., Nov. 17.—(AP)—Two B-29s carrying 21 crewmen collided five miles above Stockton at midnight and crashed with earthshaking impact in nearby fog shrouded delta country. Only four men are known to have survived the collision over this central California city 75 miles east of San Francisco. They spilled out of the planes in parachute.

Those of them came out of one Superfort which plunged down in flames on a McDonald island levee on the San Joaquin river, nine miles west of Stockton.

Full Section Showed Off The other four ejection bomber ploughed six feet into the mud on a nearby island north of the river. It barely missed a ranch farmhouse with 30 laborers as it crashed. The high tail section showed off.

It was a tragedy leading to a training flight of 13 Superforts from the 32nd Bombardment group at Spokhane, Wash. Army B-29s were down in the Atlantic near Bermuda yesterday with 20 aboard.

Spokane Air Base first gave the total crewman on the two planes at 22 but later revised the number to 21. It said there were 19 on the McDonald plane and 11 on the other.

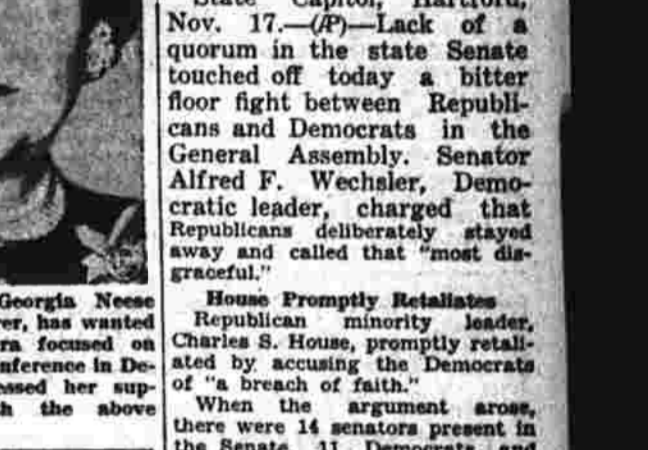
