

Hope to Dig Out Funds

Republican Leaders Now Turning to Bookkeeping Item as Source

Hartford, Nov. 21.—Republican leaders today turned to a \$11,500,000 bookkeeping item as a possible source for money needed to pay for a school building program.

Chairmen of legislative committees met at the Union League club in New Haven to explore this item to see how much of it, if any, could be rolled back for educational purposes.

They went to work on data supplied to Rep. Nelson L. Carpenter, House Appropriations committee chairman, by the state auditor.

Representative Carpenter turned over to State Chairman Charles F. Baldwin. The item is the total amount of continuing appropriations carried over on the various items in the account card.

State fiscal experts say the various items in the account card will be unscrambled without extensive research and were doubtless they can be relied upon for service in the partisan dispute over financing a school program.

Hope to Have Program Ready by Tomorrow morning the legislature reconvenes. G. O. P. leaders hope to have a program for presentation to a party caucus.

They are talking of adding at least \$10 per pupil to the present state aid bill. This means they must find at least \$2,500,000 which Finance committee chairman James B. Lowell says is not available.

Uncovered in the top treasure hunt an account representing special appropriations not yet spent. Among them are:

1. \$2,000,000 voted in 1948 for building and equipment at the Veterans' home and hospital in Rocky Hill.

2. \$500,000 for trade school equipment in New Haven and Waterbury. The present Legislature adopted a bond issue for the school expansion. Republicans say it would not be needed if the original \$500,000.

3. \$700,000 for a new armory in Bridgeport. The balance is reported made up of construction projects in various stages of development.

No Up-to-Date Report. No state agency today seemed able to provide an up-to-date report on the status of the various items. The state auditor, finance and comptroller departments appeared in agreement that only a minute study of each item from the records which is free from commitment, and, therefore, available for any roll back by legislative action. A large part of the total is now the hands of the Real Estate division which plans building projects.



Greek Communists' Retreat Means Thousands of Refugees Go Home

Washington—(NEA)—The village of Keramidi has come back home. With the help of the Economic Cooperation Administration's mission in Greece, the biggest single repatriation movement ever attempted in Greece was completed when 1700 refugees were landed.

For almost a year and a half, the 1700 had been refugees from the Greek civil war, living on government "Landing Craft" camps. Typical of the 700,000 Green men, women and children driven from their homes by Communist bandit activity during the past three years.

Now that the Greek Army has all but chased the Reds out of Greece, almost half that number have been returned to their native villages. By the end of 1948, 800,000 refugees had been repatriated, mostly from frontier areas, which are now Communist territory.

Diarrhea Can Result in Death If It Doesn't Receive Attention

It is not, strictly speaking, a disease, since many different disorders can cause this symptom. The most common cause, however, is that of nervous origin. Many people seem to show the effects of nervousness or emotional strain by developing diarrhea.

The intestinal nerve that waves the motions by which intestinal contents are carried on down the digestive tract is the autonomic nervous system. When a susceptible person becomes excited or emotionally upset, the nerve control of the intestines is disturbed, the waves the motions are increased, and what is called diarrhea develops.
