But reports from throughout the country showed that large groups of workers insisted on staying on the job, Hundreds of thousands of Frenchmen walked or rode bicycles in a determined effort to get to work.

Effects of the strike on normal life were not very noticeable.

Times Cash of 1939

Washington, Nov. 25—(P)—The average American is taking in almost three times as much money as he did in prewar 1939 and he's spending it a little more freely than he did even three months ago.

The Federal Reserve board reported last night that consumer income is 190 per cent higher than 1939, just three per cent under the peak reached last year.

And the board noted that people as a whole are spending an increasing proportion of their income \$93.10 per \$100 of income after taxes in the third quarter of this year as compared with \$91.60 in the first quarter and \$92.30 in the third quarter of last year.
