Clear Walks, Chief Warns

operty Owners Here Must Remove Snow or Face Arrest

Chief of Police Herman O Schendel issued a warning today that those property owners who do not comply with the Town by-laws net comply with the Town by-laws regulating the removal of ice and snow from sidewalks within 24 hours after the sleet or snow has fallen, will be arrested.

Pointing out that several damage suits have been brought against the Town because of personal injuries received in falls on slippery sidewalks, Chief Schendel stated that "the Town shouldn't be made to pay for the negligence of those people who don't take care of their walks." He added that strict enforcement of the regulation will serve to protect the Town from damage suits.
