### Asks Federal Funds To Aid Communities

**Patterson Urges Considering Financing of Worthy Public Works of Local Nature**  
Washington, Dec. 8.—(AP)—Representative Patterson (R., Conn.) asked the White House today to consider Federal financing of worthy public works of a local nature in communities remaining in the acute unemployment category.

He made public a letter to Presidential Assistant John H. Harlan asking the present program of concentrating government purchases and work in distressed areas is sufficient.

Figures Not Available  
Patterson also said that figures released by the White House last week concerning financial assistance given sections of high unemployment were not realistic.

For instance, he said, the sum of \$1,723,017 was listed as allocated in the form of government procurement contracts during July, August and September to Waterville, Conn.

"While this figure sounds impressive standing alone," Patterson wrote, "there is little variance from other three-month periods before the designation of distress areas. The total sum granted to the industries of the entire state, \$8,105,241—is likewise not much more than normal for such a designated and heavily industrialized state."

"It may be safely concluded," Patterson wrote, "that any substantial increase in employment and production are not directly attributable to changes in Federal procurement procedure."

"Renale in Distress Areas"






