Protestant Leaders Want Speech Freedom, Worship, In European Countries

with the Protestant transion, they are little concerned with the differences of institutions as such and much more concerned with the development of individualism. What they see as a goal is a classless society which will allow very few economic privileges but a great deal of individual freedom in speech and worship.

In talking with various Protestant leaders it became clear that what they wanted the United States to de more than anything was to reseasuade Europe into union

States to de more than anything was to persuade Europe into union and perhaps make political union a condition for further aid from the United States. In asking for such a union, they place very little emphasis on the specifically religious institutions which might be a part of it. By and large they do not want established churches paid by the State. They would rather see a separation of Church and State which will make it possible for them to give denominational expression to Christianity. If religious freedom is not a part of the new political union, Protestant leaders feel that the foundations of real liberty will be missing.

dations of real liberty will be missing.

Protestant thought and action in the political realm is less spectacular than that of the Catholic Church, but is just as real. It is, of course, just as impossible to be a thorough-going Communist and remain a Protestant as it is to remain a Catholic.

I got the distinct impression that Protestant leadership is of a high quality, and that if they are given the proper kind of assistance from the United States and from the American churches, their movement toward unity and their political consciousness would play an increasingly important role in the life of Europe.

But the Protestants have certain special problems which make
