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Admits Theft Of Fur Coat

New Haven Salesman Given Suspended Sentence For Action

New London, Dec. 14.—John J. Hryh, Jr., 25, a salesman, of 283 Norton street, New Haven, pleaded guilty to theft of a fur coat valued at \$150 in superior court here today. Judge John M. Conley gave him a suspended sentence of a year in jail and put him on probation for two years.

State Attorney Robert P. Anderson told the court that Hryh tossed a fur coat belonging to Mrs. Gustavus O'Connor of this city on the floor of a rooming house in New Haven on the night of December 11, retrieved it outdoors and drove off with it locked in the trunk of his car. David Franklin, a waiter at the inn, who had become suspicious of Hryh's accompaniment James F. Sullivan on a tour of the city night spots and who found the accused at a look hotel, Anderson said. Though Hryh denied any knowledge of the missing coat, he said, Sullivan searched his hotel room and a car the accused said was his as a parking lot. The parking lot attendant, according to Anderson, told the patrolman Hryh had shown him the wrong car. When the attendant was unable to print out the right one, Sullivan checked the registrations of all the cars in the lot until he found one in Hryh's name, the state's attorney said. In the trunk was Mrs. O'Connor's coat, he said. In view of the fact that Hryh had been on probation for a year for a similar offense, Anderson recommended a suspended sentence and probation. Concurring Attorney Morris Lubchansky, appearing for Hryh, said his client had acted on impulse and later tried to elude the police in the hope that he could return the coat without being detected.

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Truman Enjoys Best Vacation

By Douglas Larson

Key West, Fla.—(AP)—The tall and slender President Truman's "best vacation ever" finds him with probably the finest combination of physical health and mental outlook that he has enjoyed since becoming the nation's number one citizen.

Gen. Wallace Graham, the president's doctor, testifies to his physical strength, which is considerably bolstered by the rest and tropical sun his vacation here has afforded. He has not only lost weight, but has also revealed his completely composed state of mind and excellent outlook on the future.

The facts of the president's excellent physical health and mental outlook were made perfectly obvious to reporters when the president made his famous remarks to the press on the day after he returned to Washington.

The atmosphere which the president has created in his headquarters and the reporters is more that of his home town in Independence, Mo., than of a presidential campaign in Washington.

It is difficult to remember that the easy-going, tactful, friendly hand of a man who composed the presidential state of mind still laughing the staggering job of leading the federal government.

A peek at one of the president's conversations today were like a meeting of the Independence, Mo. town council on a summer evening.

Perhaps the best reason for changing to "little Independence" however, is the complete independence in effect, he has said to his cabinet and Democratic big boys:

"I'm the boss here. I need a rest and quiet for a while. Please don't bother me for a few weeks."

Practically every member of the cabinet and every important Democrat who wanted to see the president even announced in Boston that he was planning to come down for a brief stop.

Only a few but the most important cabinet members had drafted the high gate around the house.

This vacation also provides maximum rest for the president and his staff from the hundreds of organizations and persons who want to present their views or that to the chief executive.

Only a small switchboard is set up for the president's secretary to take calls, and the operator merely says "No, the president is not in." Nobody would be back for several days.

The privacy which the heavily-guarded naval base and the geography of Key West provide also appeals to Mr. Truman and Margaret. Mrs. Truman wears red and relaxes and admits it's a welcome interlude from that social page of Washington.

The Little White House is the former home of commanding officer of the base. On the first floor it has a dining room with seating for 20, and a living room with the same size. There is a medium-sized kitchen and only a handful of servants for the whole house.

The president works in a small office on the second floor. There are four bedrooms on the second floor. Only view from a bedroom is of Navy buildings and high lighthouse.

There, winter furniture, grass rugs, simple drapes and a few ornamental items make the place resemble any beach cottage. The house has no air conditioning.

The president's daily routine is as simple as the house. The evening meal, attended by 15 to 20 members of the staff, most in sport shirts is the only thing ever resembling formality. And he is never seen on top side bridge off the base. It's three weeks of walking, fishing, swimming and the minimum of work necessary to keep the federal government adequately directed.

Agree Party Must Offer Clear Choice

Truman mentioned Thomas E. Dewey of New York by name in discussing his defeat as last year's G. O. P. presidential nominee.

But Sumnerford told the committee "God knows we need a change in strategy and tactics."

The record of the party for the past 16 years demands that a brand new and fundamental concept of strategy be adopted.

"In campaign after campaign we have let the Democratic party make its own and carry it to the people by the inertia of our own programs."

"We have told the people that we did not disagree in any great measure with the objectives outlined by the Democrats, but that if we were elected we could carry out these same objectives better than our opponents."

People Not Given Clear Choice

"The plain truth is that we have not given the American people what they have a right to expect and a right to demand—a clear choice between two parties."

"We have failed and failed repeatedly to offer the American people any reason to remove the Democrats from power."

The only exception he said was in the 1946 congressional elections. The Republicans won then because our senators and congressmen met the opposition head on and gave the American people a chance.

Sumnerford said the G. O. P. should "divest itself of 'reactionism' and present a program of change to the Democrats."

Two other strategy group members, G. Mason Lovell of Pennsylvania and Gov. Alfred D. Isaacs of New Jersey told a reporter they were in general agreement with Sumnerford.

"Caveat," however, said "reactionism can be interpreted many ways. He said he is against 'reactionism' only in the sense that it means 'no change'."

The strategy committee plans to put in "package form" a program of change to the voters. It also announced no formal action or decision.

United Church Aim of Parley

Establishment Will Be Sought at Conference at Greenwich Today

Representatives of more than 10,000,000 Protestants were to attend the three-day conference. The main business will be to establish a permanent committee to explore several proposals which will be submitted to interested denominations for a United Church of Christ in America.

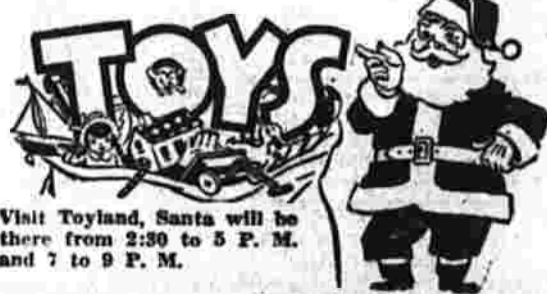

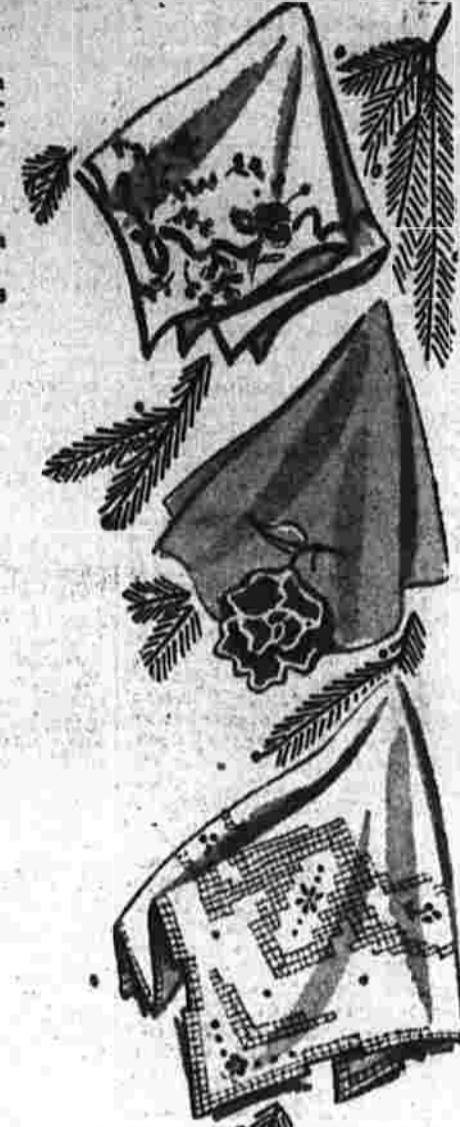

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Prices, Traffic, Swindlers Pose Holy Year Problems

Vatican City — Talking to heart's content last Holy Year, the Central Committee for the 1950 Jubilee is endeavoring to keep costs for pilgrimages as low as possible and to protect the pilgrims from profiteers, swindlers and sellers of gaudy trinkets.

It has also entered the market to provide pilgrims as many facilities as possible, at reduced rates.

This pilgrim will benefit from reduced transportation rates, low priced room and board and low priced excursions. Their pilgrim ticket—contained in the pilgrim's special Holy Year booklets at a price ranging from about 80 cents in Italy to \$3 in the United States—will entitle them to visit the Vatican museums.

They are endeavoring to obtain reductions for visits to other Italian museums. The pilgrim's envelope—million of which have already been distributed—contains a Holy Year booklet, the pilgrim's insignia and a guide of Rome.

The Central Committee's efforts aim at avoiding as much as possible the median conditions that have been experienced of centuries past when foot-wear, weary pilgrims were limited by hordes of unscrupulous hawkers, sometimes blind, and finally when they reached Rome, the cost of stay—high prices, crowded conditions of the first Jubilee of which the statistics record, that of 1900, tell that food became scarce at the third month, but that Pope Pius VIII took quick measures. He ordered nearby towns in the area to supply him with food and horses with food.

In 1975, Pope Gregory XIII had extensive stalls to supply pilgrims with donkeys during the 13th Jubilee. He also prohibited hawkers from raising their prices.

For the 1950 Holy Year 21,458 beds have been provided by the Holy Year Committee, which is cooperating with air lines, some of which already have granted reductions, and with shipping lines. Reductions have been granted by railroads in Italy, France, Austria, Germany, Spain and Switzerland, these ranging—depending upon the number of pilgrims in each group—from 20 per cent for single travelers in Germany to as high as 60 per cent for groups of 750 or more pilgrims in Italy.

In Rome, buildings to house pilgrims have been built by the Vatican and by Italian state authorities. Others have been obtained from monasteries and convents and in addition, "Peregrinatio" has contracted with private builders for construction repairing and furnishing of buildings—about \$3,000,000 coming for this work from ERP funds, of which one fourth will be returned at the end of Holy Year.

Controlled prices for rooms (subject to change if there are sharp fluctuations in currency) range from about \$1.35 a day for a room with single bed to about 20 cents for a room in which there are more than five beds.

Prices of meals range from about 25 to about \$2.50. Prices include breakfast, lunch and dinner. Controlled, price-controlled tours will be offered.

Job Benefit Plan Rapped

State Chamber of Commerce Terms Proposal As "Raid" on Funds

Hartford, December 14.—The Connecticut State Chamber of Commerce, in a bulletin to its membership today, stated that the current proposal to stretch unemployment benefits for an additional 26 weeks "would amount, if enacted, to nothing but a raid on the Compensation Fund."

Referring to the activity of labor leaders in petitioning the Governor to call an immediate four-day special session of the General Assembly for the major purpose of extending unemployment compensation benefit payments, William B. Clark, Assistant Executive Vice President and Legislative Secretary of the State Chamber, pointed out that the State Chamber provided that there must be a "special emergency" to warrant the calling of a special session of the State Chamber assembly, and that State reports show a continued upswing in Connecticut unemployment since the low point reached in July, this year.

"Why, then," he asked, "is the industry crying and we cry now, five minutes later, of an unemployment emergency?"

Continuing he said, "The Social Security Act was drafted when this country was experiencing the worst depression in its history. Even at that time of low ebbs, Congress very significantly funded unemployment compensation insurance on the fundamental principle of limiting benefits to actual compensation during a relatively short period following unemployment, while a worker is seeking other employment, or waiting to return to his former job."

"Unemployment insurance should meet, as completely as practical, cases of genuine joblessness, without taint of charity. It was not designed to be a cure-all, or a substitution for all other relief programs. Abuse of the system must be carefully guarded against and the employee must have an incentive to use his best efforts to find and hold his job, or if he loses his job, to seek and take another. Any unemployment insurance plan, which encourages unproductive employees to remain on the job, when work is available, will hurt everybody, including those craving benefit payments."

Referring to the cost of unemployment compensation when the Connecticut Unemployment Compensation Act of 1938 placed maximum benefit payments at \$12 per week for a period of 13 weeks. The present law provides \$25 per week over a 26-week period, plus up to \$12 per week—

Christmas Day Once Unmerry

First One for Pilgrims At Plymouth Was Grim, Cold, Hostile

Merry Christmas has not always been merry in American history. Unhappy times started very early. The Pilgrims landed at Plymouth four days before Christmas 1620. Christmas day found them between the Mayflower and the cold, hostile shore. Most of them were still living on the ship. And they didn't believe in celebrating Christmas anyway.

Washington's ragged troops were crossing the icy Delaware in the dark early morning hours of Christmas 1776. They defeated the Hessians at Trenton next day. Christmas 1794 found unrest in New England. Shay's rebellion raged that day. The rebels had a tough time.

In 1837, Col. Zachary Taylor and his troops were down in Florida fighting the Seminole War. Christmas day found them fighting and defeating the Indians at Lake Okechobee.

The Mexican War also saw Christmas day action when Col. Doniphan and 450 volunteers defeated 1,100 Mexicans at Bratito in 1846.

The National Capital had trouble the Christmas of 1861, when the Library of Congress and part of the Capitol burned.

Nine years later on Christmas, 1860, South Carolina issued its declaration of independence, the spark that made the Civil War inevitable.

One of the early railroad strikes, that of 1887, started Christmas day. Some 20,000 employees of the Reading Railroad walked out.

The surrender of Hong Kong on Christmas 1941 was not part of American history, but Americans watched the event anxiously. It was one step in the advance of the Japanese which came after the Pearl Harbor attack in 1941.

One of the classic Christmas stories of the 19th century will long be remembered by the men defending Bastogne in 1944. The Battle of the

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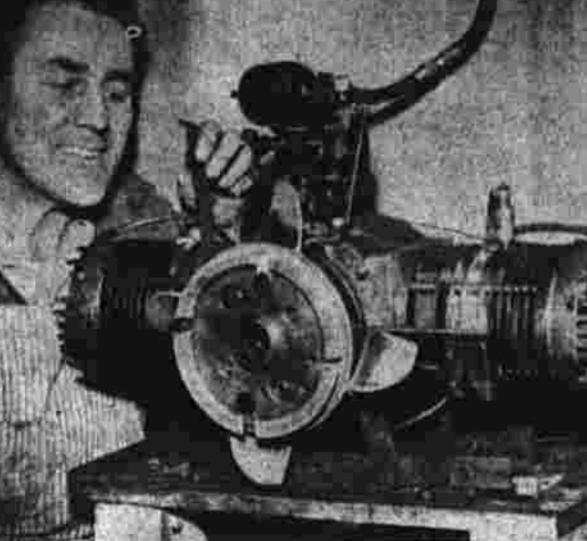

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120 'Mothers' For Dutch Girl

'Lent' Schoenmakers Is Adopted by Students at New Jersey School

Burlington, N. J.—(NEA)—For "Lent" Schoenmakers is adopted by 120 Dutch girls in the Princeton, N. J., area. The school, the Dutch Reformed Church, is celebrating its 100th anniversary. The girls, who are between 12 and 18 years old, are being adopted by the school's 120 "mothers" in America.

Of course, she'll need some help from her real mother and her younger brother, with whom she lives in Arnhem, Holland, in opening the packages. Because the Dutch that killed her father and older brothers in 1944 also took her right arm.

"Lent"—her real name is Helene Elise Gemma Maria Schoenmakers—has been adopted by the 120 students at St. Mary's Hall here. The girls have so far raised \$160 for her care, and this year will be the second Christmas that they've brightened for Lent by sending her presents.

The Girl's Service League at St. Mary's to which all the students automatically belong, is the actual unit that takes care of Lent's wants. All the girls have a hand in the human project, and keep up a running correspondence with Lent all year long.

But it is the holiday season that they enjoy the most. Then they scour the stores for things Lent might like: things she couldn't possibly afford to buy, because her family is very poor, and things that are hard to find in Arnhem even if she could afford them.

The girls at St. Mary's found Lent through the Foster Parents Plan for War Children, an American organization that is trying to do something for the thousands of European children left inadequately cared for by the war.

It was in November, 1944, that the war years of hunger, cold and fear were ended with tragedy for the Schoenmakers family. A bomb splashed a direct hit on the red miller in Arnhem where they had sought refuge.

Lent's father and older brother were killed, her mother and younger brother were injured, and by falling debris. Lent lost her right arm and suffered five other very bad wounds. Their home had previously been damaged by bombs and most of their possessions lost.

Now Lent goes to high school.

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Atomic Mystery Man Forecast War's End

Boris J. Pregel Helped U. S. W in Race to Atom Bomb and Yet Figured in Russian Shipments

Washington—(AP)—The U. S. House Un-American Activities committee's investigation of wartime shipments of uranium to Russia will probably soon bring into the open the name of Boris J. Pregel (pronounced Prezhel).

Pregel is head of the Canadian Radium and Uranium Corporation of New York. The committee's investigation of wartime shipments of uranium to Russia will probably soon bring into the open the name of Boris J. Pregel (pronounced Prezhel).

Since May, 1946, Pregel has had on file with the U. S. District Court in New York City a petition for naturalization as an American citizen. The government has been "investigating" in recent weeks it has been reported that the U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service was considering deportation proceedings.

Boris Pregel is something of a man of mystery, although his name was mentioned in a report by the House Un-American Activities committee in January, 1941, that "Upon the outbreak of the war, Pregel and the U. S. (reasonable uranium) will be used in the development of the atomic bomb."

This was printed in the Miami, Fla., Daily News, 12, 35d, under the headline, "VICTORY IN WAR MAY COME TO NATION SOLVING U-235."

Everybody apparently thought it was a pipe-dream. There was no question of citizenship then. This before the U. S. got into the war, before the first atom was split, before the Manhattan Project was founded to make the first bomb.

In the fall of 1940, Pregel tried to interest the U. S. government in building up a stockpile of uranium and radium. He was told by the Council of National Defense that uranium was a strategic material and there was no shortage.

Nevertheless, on June, 1941, Pregel made an agreement with Columbia University that led to the first atomic fission experiments in the United States.

Success of the Columbia experiments led Spettin, Urey, Fermi and other scientists to urge President Roosevelt to create an atomic energy project.

Pregel has been given full credit for his part in this pioneer development by the United States and by Alexander Sachs, intermediary between the Manhattan Project and the White House, in his testimony before the original Congressional Atomic Energy committee.

Pregel is an officer of the French Legion of Honor and one of three American residents to have received the Grand Officer of the French Association of Engineers and Doctors of Science. The other two are former President Herbert Hoover—who received the award at the same dinner that Pregel was honored—and Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower. Pregel has in his files many letters from U. S. government officials testifying to his contributions to the American war effort for work classified as secret.

Pregel was born at Odessa, Russia, in 1883, of a well-to-do Jewish family.

The Bolshevik revolution forced the family to flee, leaving all their property to the Communists when the White Russian army evacuated Odessa in 1920. They made their way to Romania, later to Belgium.

Eventually, Boris became connected with the Belgian uranium and radium refining cartel. He declared he was a French citizen and under the Romanian quota. He returned to France twice in 1940, the last trip at the death of his father.

While in France, a previous application for French citizenship was granted and he returned to the U. S. on a French passport with a non-quota visa. He was at first excluded by an Immigration Service board of special inquiry, but on appeal was admitted the next day. It is possible that some of the technicalities involved in these movements may be responsible for Pregel's difficulties with the Immigration Service.

Barriers Down To Save Ill Boy

When Pregel first came to the United States he was reported to be worth in excess of a million dollars. Associates say he is worth something less than this amount now. When Pregel came here there was only one North American producer of radium and uranium, the Eldorado Mining and Refining Co., in Great Britain. Lake region of northern Canada. He became a sales agent for this producer and is given credit for having broken the Brussels monopoly which had controlled the world market up to this time.

Later he formed Canadian Radium and Uranium Co. and became its president. His brother, Alexander Pregel, was treasurer. Exact operations of this company are now covered by atomic energy regulations.

When the Canadian government took over all radio-active mining enterprises, there were several lawsuits against the Pregel interests. A criminal action was dismissed by the government. Since Boris Pregel was not extraditable to Canada, a civil action was then begun in New York by the Eldorado Mining and Refining Co. Now a Canadian government corporation, the Canadian Radium and Uranium Co. The trial was held in camera and the record has been expunged.

Pregel has been married twice. His first wife, who died, was the daughter of a Petrograd lawyer. He scores a lot more as the only daughter of W. A. Venturi, secretary of the Interior under the Kerensky regime.

He was, for a number of years, a close friend of Henry Wallace, while Wallace was vice-president and secretary of commerce.

In his 1941 interview, Pregel predicted, "In a decade or so many of the scientific and technical developments we can look forward to an unlimited supply of energy, power and fuel, and indefinite supply of raw materials, comfort for all, and a new era of peace and progress. 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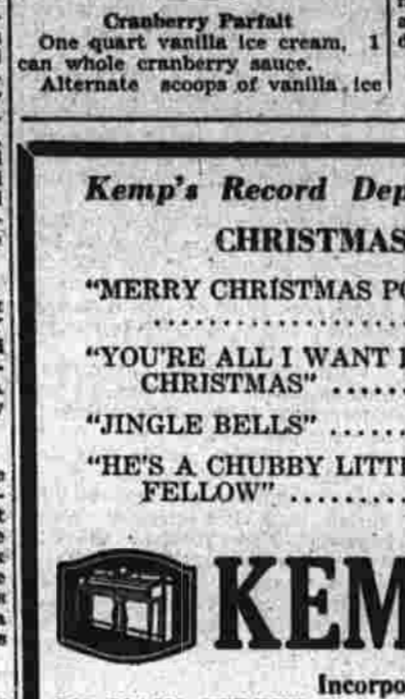
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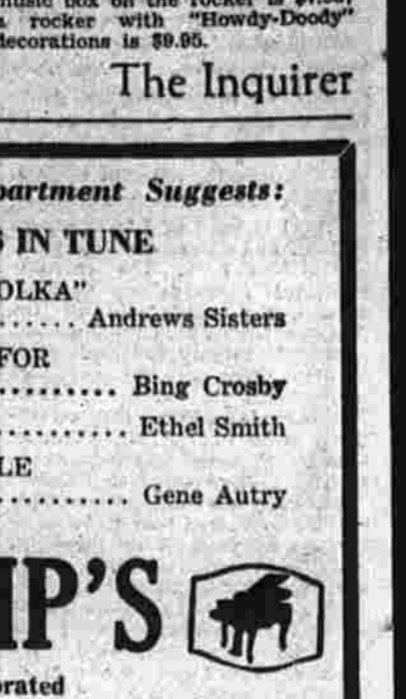
