




Steel Prices May Mount (Continued from Page One) ... produces a basic commodity which affects the price of every other commodity.

The third quarter earnings were 21 per cent below the \$175,409,219 figure for the second quarter of this year.

profits have been at record or near-record levels. Gross sales and revenues also have been at similar levels, along with payroll, taxes and other costs. The ratio of profits to sales has not changed much in recent years.

The CIO's Kaslow argued: "Almost unbelievable profits" "Here is a situation where leading steel corporations made almost unbelievable profits in their last full quarter before the strike, and are now operating at even higher levels of capacity."

"yet, on the pretense that material costs are up, they are getting ready to hike the public again. We earnestly request the joint committee to look into this scandalous situation. After all, it is less than three months since a federal fact-finding board concluded that in the light of the tremendous steel profits, price reductions—not increases—were in order."

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**Connecticut Yankee**

The news stories concerning the

 The circumstances of the retire-  
 ment have a somewhat painful  
 irony, involving a bitter clash be-  
 tween an old order of decency in  
 politics and a new order of de-  
 cency in politics. Perhaps the  
 modern day reformer, with their  
 smooth techniques and their op-  
 portunistic efficiency in the  
 cause of decent, honest govern-  
 ment, will never understand the  
 type of the great old cham-  
 pion like Gleason was forced to  
 give up, within the old political or-  
 der of things, for similar objectives.  
 Perhaps they do not understand  
 how much they should value what  
 has been.

It is reporting that the Rus-  
 sians are busy constituting a  
 East German police force which

 thing but name. That may be ac-  
 curate, or it may be a propaganda  
 device, cover for something we are  
 already doing with West German  
 police, whom American corre-  
 spondents report to be very nu-  
 merous, or for what the Russians  
 say we are planning to do, which  
 is to reestablish a German army.  
 American officials deny their  
 ambition to create a new German  
 army "at this time."

But the likely prospect in-  
 dicated is that Russia and the  
 United States are about to extend  
 their rivalry to the area of German  
 manpower, and that both of us  
 may soon openly be training and  
 equipping Germans for new war.  
 The tremendous folly of this is  
 that both the Russians and our-  
 selves seem to think that it is  
 directly possible to train Germans  
 to fight Germany. The Russians  
 think that an East German army  
 will hold their front lines for  
 them, or form the spearhead for  
 their own advance into Western  
 Germany. And we think that  
 West German army will hold our  
 front lines for us, or form the  
 spearhead of our advance into  
 East Germany. It is, in a way,  
 a very comfortable arrangement,  
 in which both Russia and the United  
 States expect to have Germans  
 become the first casualties of the  
 next war.

This fine prospect of having  
 Germans killing Germans in the  
 interest of the United States and  
 Russia is never going to come off.  
 It is not going to come off be-  
 cause any two such German  
 armies as constituted would prob-  
 ably become one German army.  
 Perhaps they would become one  
 German army on the side of the  
 East, perhaps one German army  
 on the side of the West, perhaps  
 one German army against both  
 East and West. No one knows,  
 but one does know this, which is  
 that the eventual direction of  
 both German armies would be de-  
 termined by the interests of Ger-  
 many itself, and by nothing else.  
 They would operate in the direc-  
 tion in which they imagined a  
 victory for Germany—a victory  
 which would undo the defeat of  
 Germany in the last war.

This Russian-American ambi-  
 tion to create two halves of a  
 German army like the construction  
 of the atomic bomb, in which  
 two quantities of atomic material,  
 each controllable by itself, are es-  
 tablished and packaged and held  
 in readiness. Then the moment  
 comes when the two quantities  
 are brought suddenly together,  
 and fuse, and become one. So,  
 inside Germany, Russia and the  
 United States are threatening to  
 create two separate quantities of  
 highly fissionable military man-  
 power, but are seemingly obliv-  
 ious to what would certainly hap-
