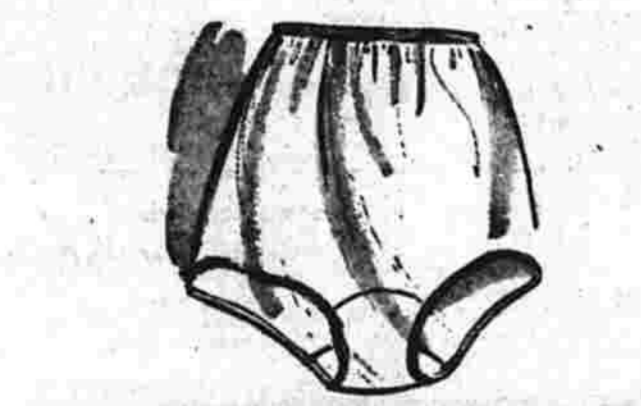

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Official Town Report Is Now in Bound Form

Distributed to Various Officials Is Available To Public; Breakdown Of Figures

The official town report, compiled for the fiscal year ended last August 14, has been completed in bound form and is being distributed to various town officials. In order to save the cost of general distribution of several thousand copies of the report, as was previously done, the budget on this cost has been reduced, permitting the compilation of only a few copies. Anyone interested may purchase the report in the town libraries or at the office of the town clerk or general manager.

The Board of Directors has considered that in the past the large part of the reports distributed did not find any actual use, and that much of the printing cost was wasted. The present method makes the report fully available, and since it does in mimeographed form, a much more complete picture of town events can be produced for those who are interested, and at a large saving to the taxpayer.

Financial Breakdown
In this report are listed the costs of each municipal activity with a financial breakdown showing the appropriations divided into salaries, contractual services and supplies costs, with total expended and the balance remaining on each division.

In its report on the audit of the town books, the auditors, H. N. Alexander and Company finds that not one account was overdrawn, and that there is a net gain in budget operations of \$60,812, with unexpended balances amounting to one mill of taxation on last year's grand list.

The auditor comments the Board of Directors on the introduction of specially prepared accounting forms, drafted by the auditor, which have drawn the interest of officials in other towns.

Auditor Alexander states that he finds the accounts in order, and that there are "no loose or improper methods in the handling of cash."

Included in the recommendations of the auditor is one suggesting that the town treasurer be assigned the duties of library treasurer. The charter failed to provide for a library treasurer, and monies now collected in fines and delinquencies are retained by the library authorities and applied against their annual costs. The auditor would have this corrected by having the libraries operate as other departments under an appropriation drafted on a gross expenditure

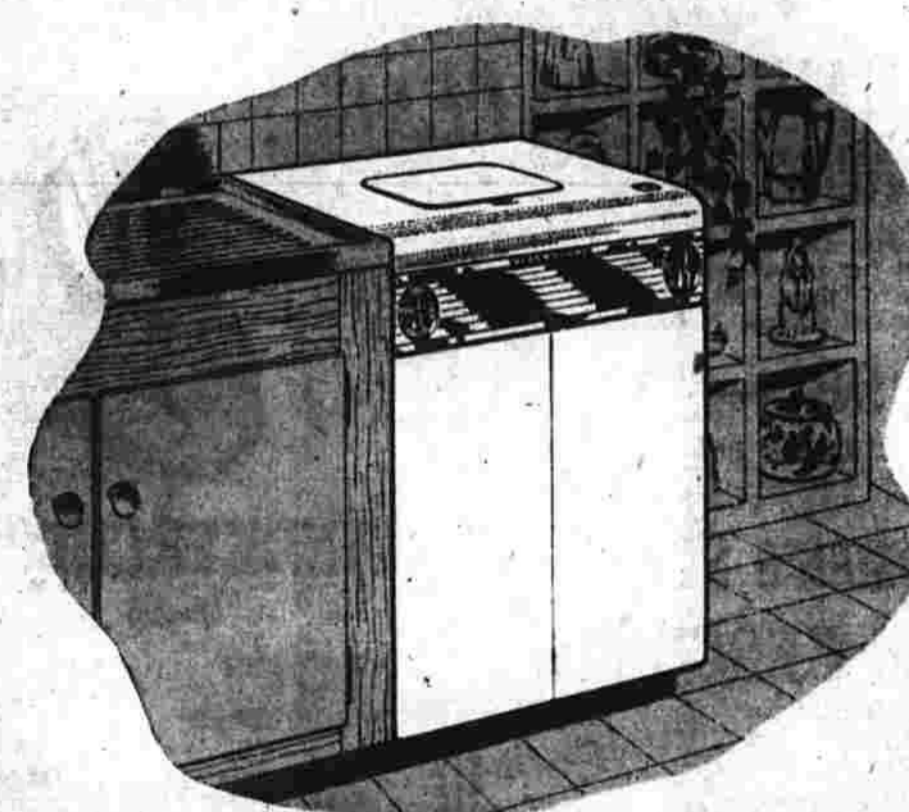

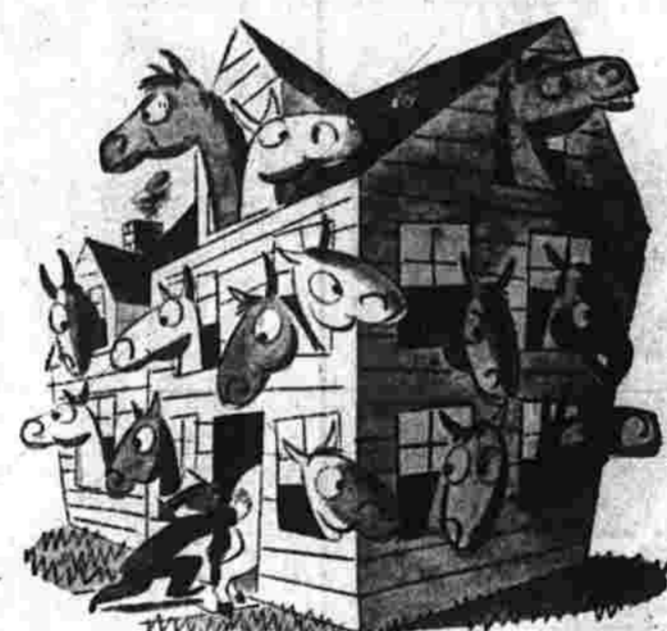

"Garrison-Police State"

The Committee for Economic Development—a thoroughly American organization comprising, in its leadership, a sound cross-section of American citizens—has issued a report discussing the defense policies of our nation. Significantly, we think, its most urgent warning is against the possible development in this country of a military police state. It fears that one of the first symptoms of such a development is the abnormal and hysterical emphasis on secrecy which some sources are trying to impose upon American life.

Without freedom, the Committee maintains, security in itself would lose its value and purpose. It describes what we hope will not prove forecast, the trend of development for what it calls the "garrison-police state."

"The soldier and political policeman," the Committee report states, "rise to power while the institutions of civilian society and freedom shrink. In the name of security, channels of public information dry up; the press becomes a mere purveyor of official hand-outs. Cut off from significant information, editors, commentators and group leaders become less accurate in their judgments."

"The process of public discussion declines. The power of Congress declines. Administration by civilian standards, relative to administration in uniform. The courts weaken. Cut off from information, the power of the citizen fades. Local plans are subordinated to central purposes."

"The free market is constricted. Labor is hedged in by special regulations. Consumers find their range of choice reduced. Decisions come to be made by an all-powerful government. All freedoms suffer."

If this is a nightmare? Not if we let certain tendencies—like President Truman himself warning members of Congress about talking in atomic matters—or like President Truman and Secretary Johnson punishing those members of the Navy who dared criticize the nation's defense policy—go unchecked.

There was a relatively harmless case example of the military mind the other day, when Lt. Gen. Leslie R. Groves testified before the House Un-American Activities Committee. The discussion was of "heavy water," of which the Russians received 41 ounces in a 1943 shipment, according to official State Department record. The committee asked General Groves if he would tell the committee who had been manufacturing heavy water during the war. He said he could not because it was "secret information."

The fact that the du Ponts and the Consolidated Mining and Smelting Co. of British Columbia, manufacturers heavy water during the war was given in the official "Smiths Report" in the Atomic Bomb, in 1945. It is a fact which has obviously been common knowledge throughout American industry.

But, even retroactively, General Groves' instinct was to make it secret.

General Groves also provides an example of another of the habitual instincts of the military. He wants to run in Connecticut next year for the Senate seat now held by Democrat Brian McMahon. Why does he happen to fancy McMahon as a target? The suggestion is that it is because Senator McMahon was very instrumental in having that the final decision of Congress was to place atomic energy under a top official control

Fairfield Man Crash Victim

Bridgport, Dec. 16.—(AP)—One man was fatally injured and another critically hurt when their automobile crashed into the rear end of a trailer truck on Boston avenue here today.

Thomas F. Walsh, Jr., 26, of 425 Warrenwood avenue, Fairfield, died at the Bridgport hospital four hours after he had been admitted suffering from a fracture of the skull and crushing internal injuries.

On the danger list was Clarence Onisko, 25, of 376 Mapledale place, Bridgport, a passenger in the car which police said was driven by Walsh. Bridgport Police Officers George Freeman and Raymond Beardsworth who investigated said that the passenger car was driven halfway under the rear of the truck. Following the crash the car burst into flames which were extinguished before they could spread to the body of the truck.

The driver of the truck, John Krasnowski, 28, of Philadelphia, was held on a technical charge in bonds of \$1000.

Choral Club's Christmas Candlelight Carol service Sunday evening at eight o'clock in the Second Congregational church, is being planned by Warren Wood, director. During the singing of the final carol, every member of both congregation and chorus will hold a lighted candle. These candles will be the only illumination in the church.

The program will include familiar carols, Christmas anthems and carols of other lands. Several members of the chorus will be present in solo numbers and also in the reading of Bible texts to be heard in the singing.

Asserts Report Kept Confidential

Hartford, Dec. 16.—(AP)—The Hartford Courant says today that Gov. Chester Rowley and Labor Commissioner John J. Ryan have been keeping under cover a report on the unemployment situation in the state.

The newspaper said a copy of the report in its possession shows that only 11,900 of 30,000 persons who abandoned their unemployment benefits during the first nine months of the year sought work through the Connecticut State employment service.

Commissioner Ryan's report, the Courant said, said that a large number of those affected are married women and elderly persons and it was possible that many who had exhausted their benefits do not want jobs at all.

The report was filed by Ryan with the governor on Nov. 8, and has been kept confidential since then. The Courant said it obtained a copy from another source.

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Hill On More Tolls

State Highway Commissioner G. Albert Hill predicts that additional toll stations will be erected on the Wilbur Cross Parkway within a year.

He adds that he himself opposes tolls, but finds himself in a minority of those confronted with the problem of financing Connecticut's highway expansion program.

Our view of him would be to continue his opposition. If he does, he may not find himself in a minority—at least as far as the people of Connecticut are concerned. The toll system is basically a system of double taxation, in which some Connecticut motorists—those whose logic and necessity dictates that they shall use those roads on which tolls have been imposed—pay twice to help build Connecticut's highway system.

The favorite theory in defense of toll roads is that it is a fair practice to have those who are going to use a certain road pay for its construction and maintenance. That might be all right, if, by some miracle of accounting, they could be excused from paying also for the regular roads they do not use. If, somehow, it could be worked out that those who use only the state's regular roads should continue to pay their taxes for the construction and maintenance of regular roads, then this theory could be considered.

Any such division is manifestly impossible; the result is that every toll road user pays double taxation.

Again, it is argued that a toll road is usually a special road, which provides convenience and a valuable saving of time. But this argument assumes that it is the business of a state to build one kind of facility for those who can afford double taxation, and another kind of facility for those of lower spending capacity. It assumes that it is all right for a state to impose a caste system on its roads.

Either we should have tolls on all roads, or we should have tolls on none. Obviously, we are going to keep the tolls we have. But they should be kept only until they have accomplished the purpose for which they were originally established, which was to pay the cost of the roads and bridges on which they are located. They should not be retained for purposes of general highway revenue, nor should new stations for that general revenue purpose be now established.

We hope Commissioner Hill has not really surrendered. He has just begun to fight.

Ostrich Vetoes

Many of Russia's vetoes in the United Nations Security Council have been trivial affairs, but none more so than the last two, by which Russia prevented the adoption of a strong little resolution congratulating the Dutch and the Indonesians, and the United Nations Commission on Indonesia, on the happy outcome of the long and troublesome war and negotiations towards independence for Indonesia, which is now expected to be formally proclaimed on Dec. 27.

Why did Russia veto?

There are perhaps two explanations. First, we suppose, Russia is still trying to persuade the Indonesians that they have misread the situation. Second, we suppose, Russia is characterized as very uncooperative and signals success for the western technique of reason and negotiation in a situation where bitter and conflict could very easily be arranged. Russia doesn't like to think that the world can make progress by rational behavior; its credo is that progress can only come under a top official control

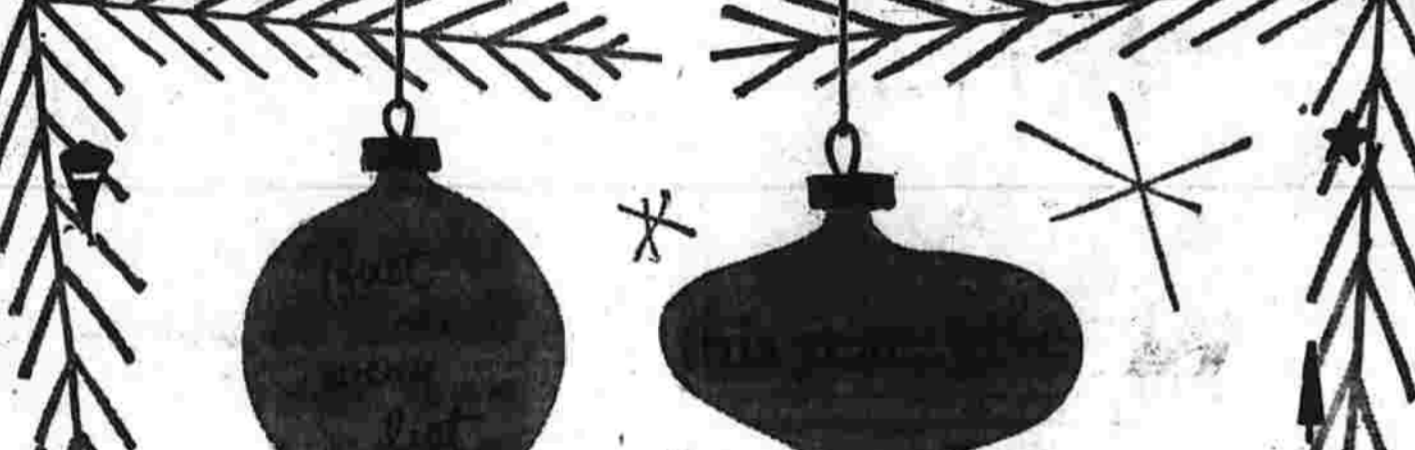

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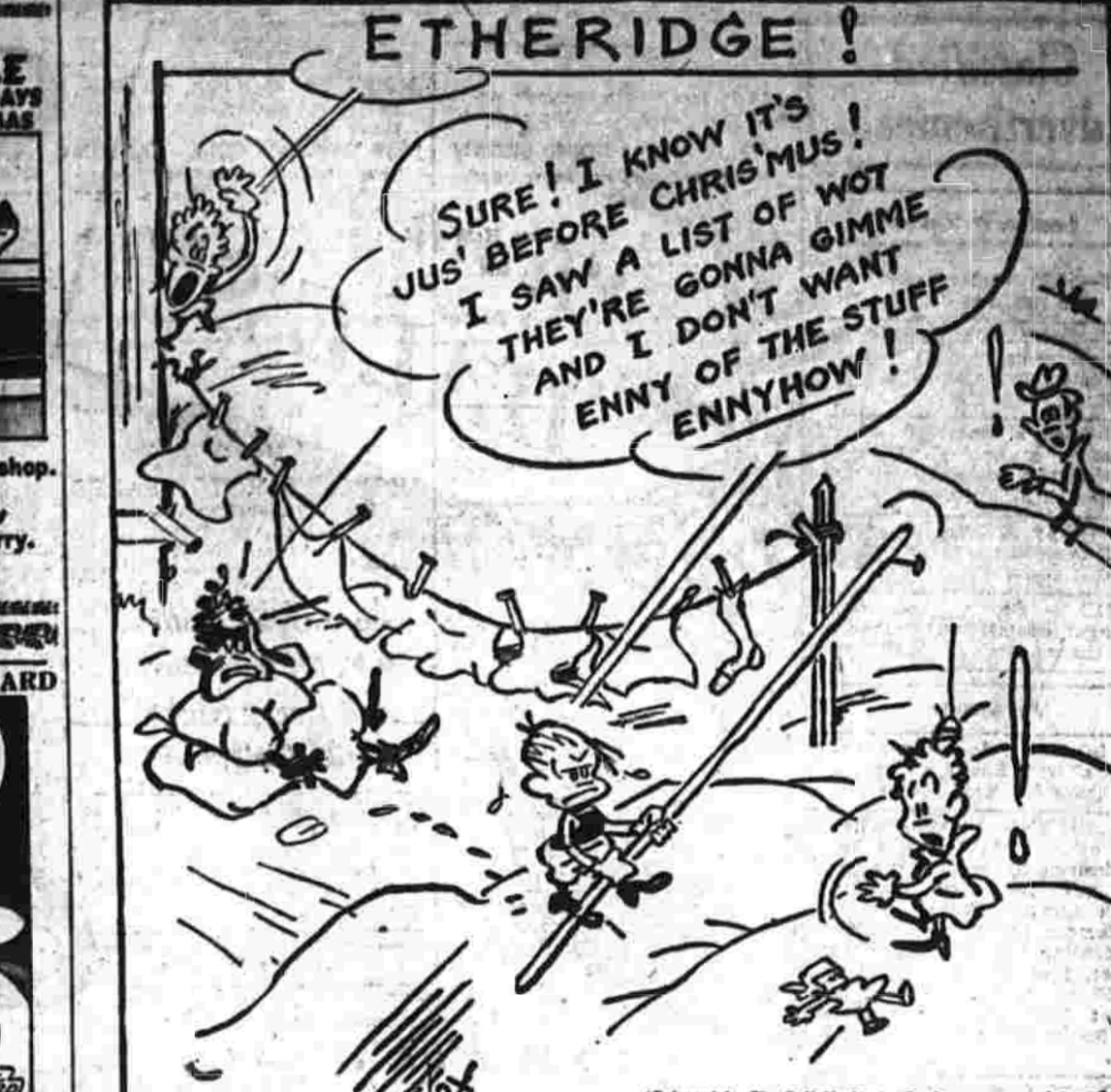

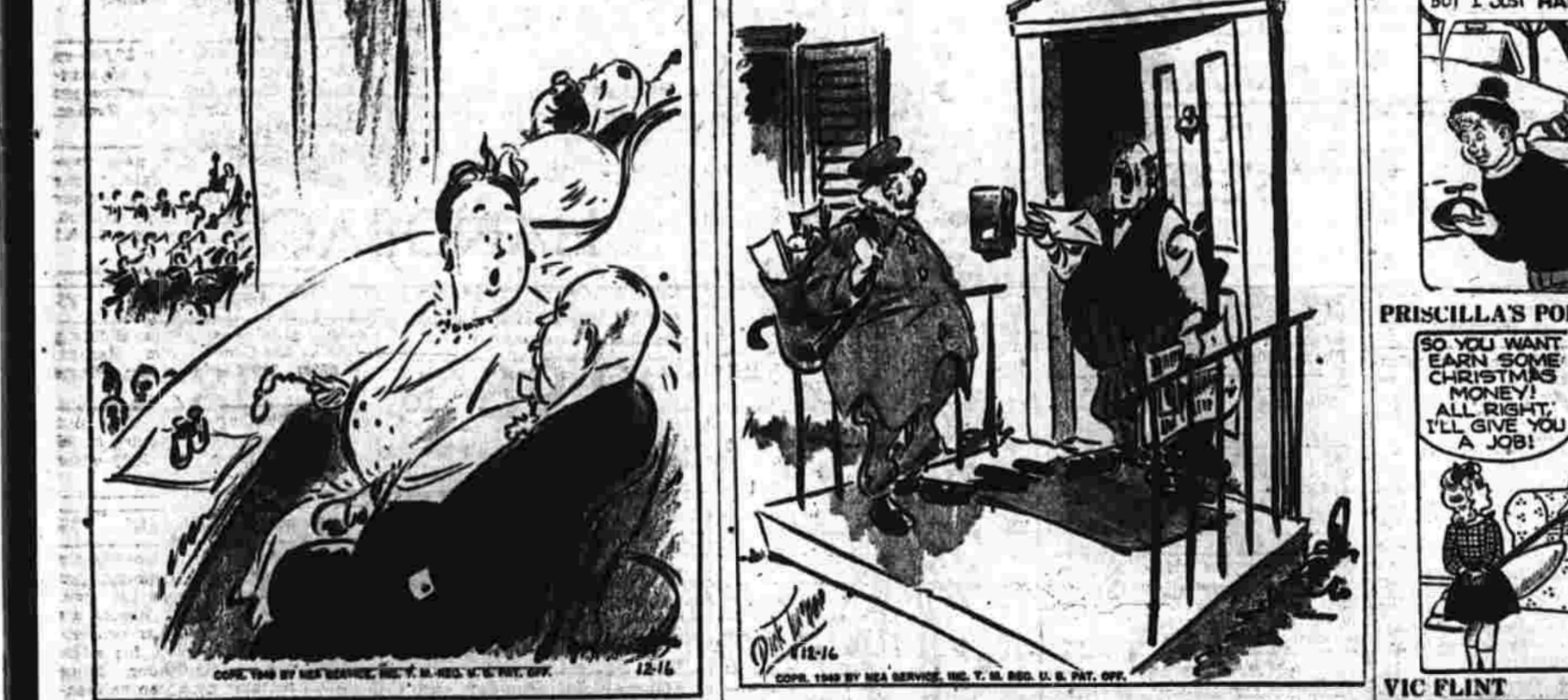
