"To the cynical young or the disillusioned old these words are irrelevant to modern life. But to the Christian they proclaim the coming of the Christ Child. Christmas therefore stands as an eternal program against the mechanizing of human relationships... or any de-personalizing influences in modern society. Together they affirm the dual relationship of modern man between God and his fellowmen. "Glorious to God" expresses his relationship with the Heavenly Father and "Peace on Earth among men" his relationship with his fellowmen. The words from the angels, the pastor asserted, "Was a prophesy a long and a hope. It pointed to the favour of the world and therefore was prophetic. It proclaimed a law of man that only by good-will would he find peace and it was a hope that as the men from different stations in life, different parts of the world, different economic backgrounds, worshipped at the manger that the spirit of Christ would indeed come so that they would show their glory to God by loving good-will toward all men."

The pastor illustrated this dual relationship of modern man in the fields of judgment, forgiveness, and comfort. One of the commands of Jesus was "Judge not that ye be not judged."

designs and standards in arms, equipment and training methods. Cooperative arrangements for this purpose are being made by the control of any country concerned over any of the activities in its territory.

"These arrangements, which are under discussion since 1947, are a step towards the fulfillment of the wider arrangement of the United Nations for the Military Production and Supply Board which is the promotion of standardization of the parts and end products of military equipment in the European and Atlantic area. They are similar to arrangements already made by the Brussels treaty group."

Members of the Brussels treaty group—France, Luxembourg, Belgium and Holland—already have made considerable progress in standardization.

Reserve Drill Pay Reduced

Only 35 Units Not Affected by Order; 26 Have Pay Eliminated

Hartford, Dec. 19—(AP)—Drill pay for 128 Army Reserve Corps units in Connecticut for the remainder of the fiscal year has been reduced or eliminated.

The change in policy by the Department of the Army was announced today by Col. Harry R. Pierce, senior instructor for the Reserve in Connecticut.

Only 35 reserve units are not affected by the order. They are in the Class A category or assigned to the 15-25 division program. Ninety-seven units, including the 7th division, will be allowed only six paid drill periods for the fiscal year.

The remaining 26 organizations will receive no pay.

Reasons given by the Army for the reduction are: The recent pay bill passed by Congress raising the salaries of all personnel and the greatly increased participation in the ROTC program.

It was also announced that the 7th division would train again this summer at Camp Edwards, August 13 to 27. Estimated quotas have been set up for the reserve summer training program and it was indicated that the practice of assigning over-strength officers to these units during their summer encampments will be discontinued.

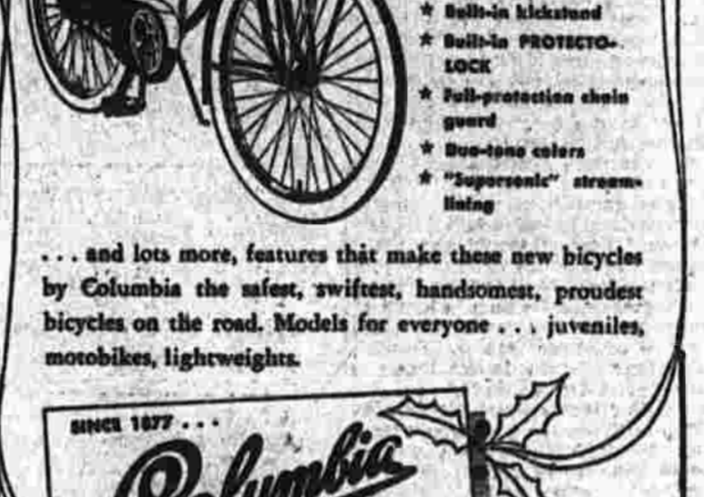
