Carol Singing Violates Rules

New Haven, Dec. 24.—(AP)—Singing Christmas carols in the corridors of Wilbur Cross High school got 10 juniors in hot water yesterday. The boys were singing while delivering Christmas greeting cards in their home room teacher's and principal's.

James J. Valenti, assistant principal, said the impromptu singing violated instructions limiting singing to organized programs. Besides, he said, the boys' singing was not in a melodious manner or in the true Christmas spirit. Valenti ordered them to leave the building.

The boys left undelivered a card they had for Valenti. It has this wording on its cover, "Christmas blessings to the one I love."

Divorced Wife Wounds Pair

Athens, Ga., Dec. 24.—(AP)—Five bullets fired by a middle-aged divorcée on a pair of young boys at the University of Georgia, and critically wounded his pretty former secretary.

Police Chief Clarence Roberts said Mrs. Kathleen Dewrey was taken into custody at her home as she telephoned friends of shooting her 47-year-old husband and Miss Miriam Thurmond, a tall attractive brunette.

Miss Thurmond, wounded twice in the stomach and Dewrey, who received three bullets in the chest, were taken to Athens General hospital.

Dr. Harry Talmadge reported that the dark-haired former secretary was in a more critical condition than Dewrey, but that both were "doing all right and are expected to pull through."

Chief Roberts said Mrs. Dewrey would probably be questioned at length today for details and motive of the shooting.

Daughter Sees Mother Kill Self

Sacramento, Calif., Dec. 24.—(AP)—A car stopped near the railroad track.

The young mother of six small children cried out to her seven-year-old daughter:

"Tell your father I love him very much. And always will. Now don't watch what I'm going to do."

Then, as the child looked on in horror, she fled to the tracks and threw herself in front of an on-rushing train.

The woman, Mrs. Faith M. Land, 29, was fatally injured. She died yesterday.

Her body fell between the tracks and a head injury caused her death.

Hundreds of North End youngsters will be treated to the annual Christmas party by the Improvement Association at the Y tonight. Over 1,000 kiddies are expected to fill the Y gym to greet Saint Nick when he arrives to make his usual appearance before starting out on his night's work.

A Flight of Fancy?
 It is a rather strange Christmas. Unusual things have been happening in the big world, and in the world where individual men and women live. We don't quite know what to make of it. But it rather looks as if some people are trying to let Him, in all His wholesome simplicity, be born again in their own hearts.

Perhaps this impression began during the holiday season, when we noted the war between some Connecticut communities over the question of whether should light up their shopping streets Christmas decorations first, this gaining a first lap on Christmas Eve. One of the things that followed was a speech from a gentleman who, we suspect, has not yet grown into an appreciation of the simple fact that "nothing can take the place of the personal interest of one human soul towards another."

But Charles A. Lindbergh, in a Washington speech, had grown enough to say this:

"Personally, I am convinced that man cannot thrive indefinitely in the hot-house we are creating. I believe that for permanent survival he must balance science with other qualities of life, qualities of body and spirit as well as those of mind—qualities he cannot develop when he lets mechanism and luxury insulate him too greatly from the earth to which he was born."

That was a day or two after "The Catholic Review," edited by the Rev. John Sinnott Martin, had taken a tremendous swipe at the kind of figure Santa Claus has become.

"Santa the saint," said his editorial, "has been lost in Santa the sugar daddy."

Then we were reading a review of a book collection of Christmas stories.

"Among all those here presented," the reviewer wrote, "the story most expressive of the true Christ spirit of Christmas is Leo Tolstoy's 'What Love Is, That Love Is Also.'—artless tale of the shoemaker, Martin Andryevich, who read the Gospels and tried to put into practice what he learned from them of compassion and kindness, and the ineffable joy he found thereby."

So we went up to Mary Cheney Library, that afternoon, and read the story. And the first thing we noticed was what the traveling holy man who met the little shoemaker off on his adventure told him about his own past life.

The shoemaker's mistake, the holy man said, was that he had been living for his own happiness. We might conceivably have been quite different toward this review of impressions, stating simply that it had been for one or two conventional acceptances.

Legal Rental Rules Cited

Feas to Continue to Be in Force Through Life of Present Law

Hartford, Dec. 24.—When rent increases under the 1948 Federal Rent Control Law expire at the end of this month, the maximum legal rent for rental units covered by such leases will continue to be the rent specified in the lease, Rent Director James L. DeLacis reminded today. Also, the rental units that these leases covered will continue to be under Federal Rent Control for the life of the present rent law, which continues through June 30, 1950. The same applies to all rental units where such leases have already terminated, or will terminate in the future before the expiration date in the leases.

"This means, of course," Mr. DeLacis added, "that landlords who have such properties may, if they have grounds specified in the rent law, petition the area rent office for a rent increase. These increases, if granted, will become effective after the leases expire."

Both the 1947 and 1948 rent laws contained provisions permitting landlords and tenants to voluntarily agree between themselves upon rent increases up to 10 per cent. These agreements had to be in the form of leases and were required to be filed in the area rent office. Under the 1947 law, these leases had to last at least until December 31, 1949. Therefore, most of the leases signed under that law will expire on that date. There will be some, however, which will be for terms extending beyond the end of the year.

The present law contains no provision for such leases. The rent director emphasized that an individual rent increase on a distressed housing accommodation in a legal unit is a violation of the law for the increase is issued by the rent office after consideration of the landlord's petition asking for the increase. If a rent increase order is issued, the landlord receives such an order, and the tenant is also notified.

"Any landlord or tenant who has any question regarding his rights or obligations under these laws are urged to contact the Rent Office at 119 Ann street, Hartford, and the effect of the law on his particular case will be carefully explained to him. In fact, we are most anxious to assist landlords and tenants in any problem under the Federal Rent Law that they may have, whether it pertains to leases or something else."

Norwich Doctor Taken by Death

Norwich, Dec. 24.—Dr. Albert C. Freeman, 66, prominent Norwich physician, died at the W. W. Backus hospital here yesterday following a short illness. A native of Berlin, Ia., he was a graduate of the University of Vermont Medical school, served his internship at the Backus hospital and began private practice here in 1916.

He was affiliated with the American Medical association, the Connecticut State Medical association and the Norwich Medical society. At the time of his death he was chief of the medical staff at the Backus hospital.

He leaves his widow and four children.

Funeral services will be conducted here Tuesday.

Bidaut Is Given Confidence Vote

Paris, Dec. 24.—(AP)—Premier Georges Bidaut's coalition French government still faced shaky times today even though it had won a narrow vote of confidence on the national budget.

The lower house of the National Assembly today rejected a motion of censure against the government, but by a margin of only 227,000,000 francs (400,000,000) instead of a lower opposition vote.

But the government still could stand or fall on the item-by-item discussion and vote. To come, today's balloting the vote was 303 to 297 in favor of Bidaut's coalition of his own Popular Republican Movement, radical Socialist and Socialist parties.

Bodies of Six Still Missing

Savannah, Ga., Dec. 24.—A swamp buggy crew today drew the task of searching the wreckage of a 2-30 Air Force bomber for the bodies of six missing airmen.

Five bodies already have been removed from the debris field in a bog bordering the Savannah river.

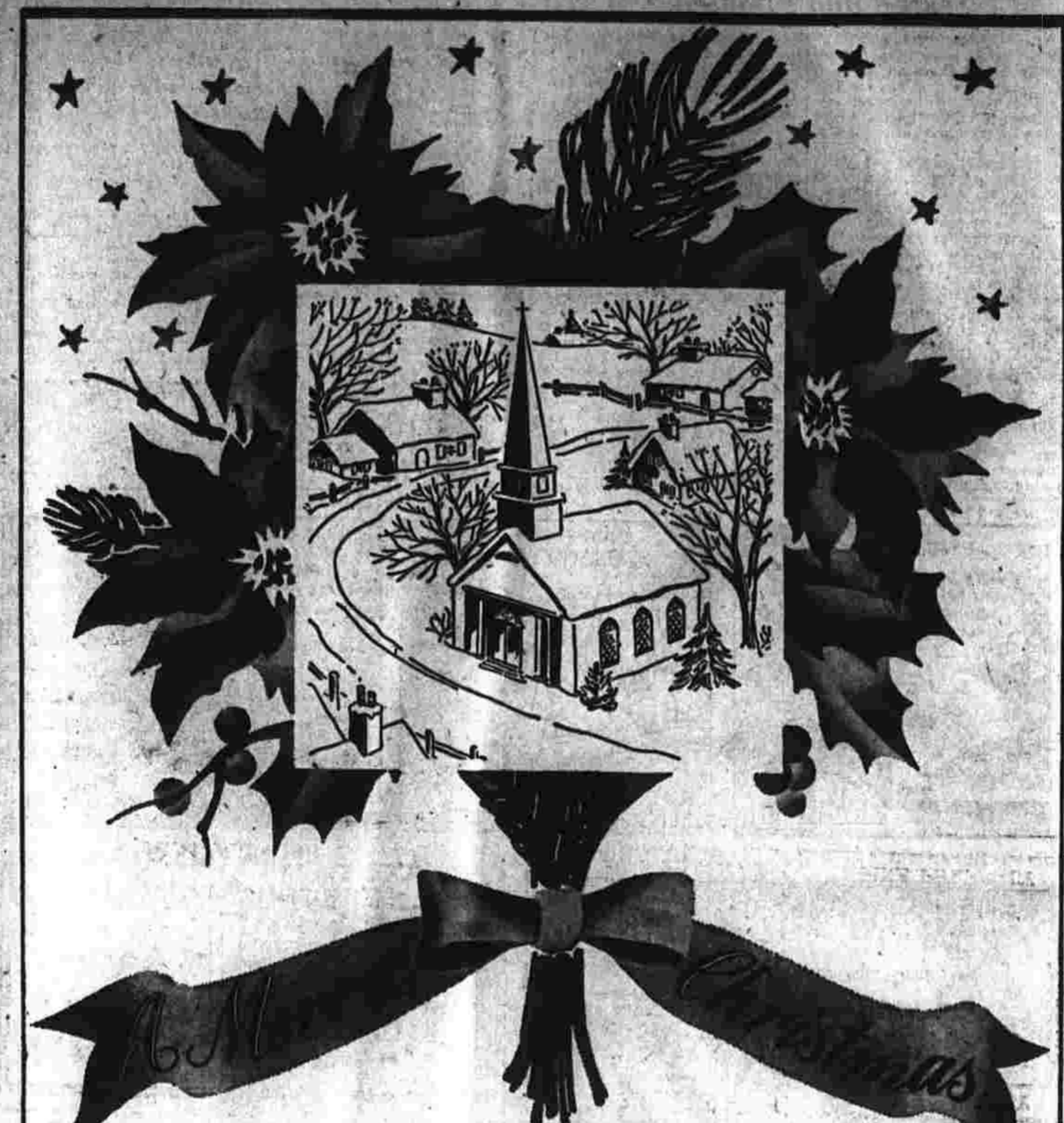
