



Democrate quickly acceded to the governor's go-home order. Republicans, however, challenged the governor's right to end the session. Defiantly, the House met alone a week later, accused Bowles of acting like a dictator and then recessed indefinitely.

Chief reason for that first special session was that the Legislature, again establishing a precedent, adjourned its regular meeting without approving a state budget. The legislators finally managed to complete that fiscal chore before getting into the wrangle over adjournment.





Congress is expected to approve, in the coming session, an enlargement of social security benefits roughly in proportion to next Sunday's boost in the social security payroll tax. 




