Bowles-Assembly Feud Producer of Headlines

Relations So Steeped in Strife That Political Battle Appears Storming To New Climax

New Haven, Dec. 29.—(AP)—A story still without an end—the feud between Gov. Charles Bowles and the General Assembly—produced most of the big 1949 political headlines in Connecticut.

The political feud began early in the troubled life of the late Legislature and the equally troubled life of the new Democratic administration headed by Bowles. As the year neared a close, their relations were still so steeped in strife that the political battle of many thousands appearing during the next session of 1950, a big election year for Connecticut.

Unspoken Approval For Pensions Rush

Many Government Officials Have Misgivings Regarding Labor Asking Private Programs

By Irving F. Green
Washington, Dec. 30.—(AP)—The administration's unspoken approval of labor's hesitating rush for private bargained old age pensions. But many officials today have misgivings.

Some think it is time to frame a national policy, in terms like these:
1. That some standards for pensions should be applied to all workers — a standard at least based on the needs of the worker more than on the power of his union to bend the employer to its will.

Not that labor's pension demands have as much potential liability as say, a pending damage suit. The agency's report to the American Institute of Public Accountants to recommend a new method of computing claims should be shown when companies invite the public to buy out their pension plans.

John L. Lewis' pension plan is that type, except that it is industry-wide. It is a distribution of the money he has accumulated in his own funds. Lewis' plan is not a pension plan, but a distribution of his own funds.

Other workers' pension plans are also being set up. The reason is obvious. The current plan is for the company to foot the whole bill or most of it. In the Federal system, workers and management split the cost equally.

State Surveys Lead Exports

Biggest Gain in Foreign Trade Made in Electrical Machinery

Hartford, Dec. 30.—Although topped in dollar volume by machinery (except electrical) and iron and steel products, Connecticut's most substantial gain in exports last year was made in electrical machinery which, according to State Development Commission estimates, increased by 14.2 per cent.

This category, which includes wiring devices, electrical measuring instruments, most electrical appliances, installed electrical cable, automotive electrical equipment, communication equipment, etc., increased from \$17,800,000 in 1947 to \$20,300,000 last year, the commission estimated. Today from a state-wide foreign trade survey to which 401 manufacturers replied.

Second in volume among Connecticut's exports in 1947 and 1948 was the iron and steel products, which reflected foreign demand for such products as iron and steel pipe, castings, forgings, and other iron and steel products.

Other estimates in some of the major industrial categories for 1947 and 1948 respectively were reported by the Development Commission as follows:
Transportation Equipment, \$10,000,000; Non-Ferrous Metal Products (brass, copper, aluminum, etc.), \$8,700,000; Electrical Machinery, \$7,500,000; Chemicals, \$2,500,000; Rubber Products, \$1,800,000; Iron and Steel Products, \$3,500,000; \$4,900,000.

Engaged to Wed Seek Review For Buteau

Special Public Defenders Make Appeal to U. S. Supreme Court

New Haven, Dec. 30.—Lawyer David James O. Buteau, 31, under death sentence in state prison, has asked the U. S. Supreme court to review his first degree murder conviction.

The petition asking an examination of Buteau's case was filed in Washington yesterday by Special Public Defenders Philip R. Pastorek and William T. Holleran. They contended that Buteau's constitutional rights under the due process clause of the 14th amendment were violated by an "illegal detention" during which confession, used at his trial, were obtained.

A decision of the Connecticut supreme court upholding the conviction, said the petition, involves a serious question in the administration of state criminal justice in a capital case.

"Unlawful Conduct" His
"The practical effect of the decision," it was asserted, "is to sanction a procedure whereby the deputy coroner's inquest is used by the police, prosecuting authorities and coroner as a cloak to escape the consequences of their inequitable conduct which would have been barred from evidence a confession if taken by police following such conduct."

Buteau was convicted on Dec. 1, 1947 for the slaying of James A. Grant, an assistant manager of the W. T. Grant store in Meriden, during an attempted robbery. He was sentenced to die in the electric chair next April 10, after the Supreme court affirmed a conviction last Aug. 18. An appeal, Albert T. Breaux, 38, was permitted to plead guilty to second degree murder, and is now serving life.

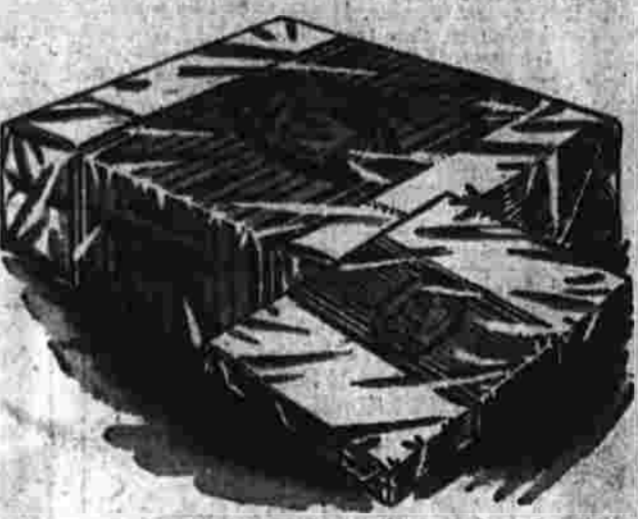
