**Hospital Rate Averages** Low

Daily Room Charge Is Below That of 34 Under Blue Cross

Statistics compiled recently by the Connecticut Blue Cross show that the average daily room rate charged at Manchester Memorial hospital is slightly lower than the average charged by the thirty-four member hospitals in Connecticut. The average daily room rate for all hospitals is \$10.49 a day, while that of, Manchester Memorial Hospital is \$9.90, which is fiftynine cents a day less than the average for all hospitals in Connecticut. Inine cents a day less than the average for all hospitals in Connecticut. The amount of \$9.90 is the "average" daily room charge. Some rates are higher, some lower, depending on the location of bed.

This shows that Manchester Memorial Hospital rates are neither to high nor too low but in line with the hospital's policy of keeping rates at a reasonable figure.

Local hospital suthorities say that about fifty per cent of their patients have some form of hospital insurance. With such insurance the public finds it much casier to pay for its hospital services, and the family pocketbook also remains in a healthy condi-
