## Polio Campaign Is Underway

Folders Mailed to 9,900 Families Today; Ten People Do Work

March of Dimes coal folders addressed to the 9,900 families in Manchester were placed in the mail today, according to information received from Mrs. Alice Perry, 38 Irving street, chairman of the Coal Folder Committee. Residents will find the folders tomorrow, she said.

Ten people, eight city directors and many hours of work were necessary to place the folders in the mail. The 10-member committee started working on the folders last Friday and finished last night. Eight directors were directed to the workers enabling them to compile their 9,900 name list.

Included with each coal folder is a return-addressed envelope that will drive the contributions to Drive Treasurer George Frost of the Manchester Trust company. Mrs. Perry stated that she still has some extra folders and targets those who do not get a folder to contact her, and a coin folder will be mailed to them. Some of the folders have been overlooked and are being mailed to them, especially those who have moved into Manchester since the directory was compiled in August, she said. Contributions may also be mailed to Mr. Frost at the Trust company.

At a meeting of the Manchester March of Dimes committee held last night at the Municipal Building, Chairman Philip Bayler directed that over 100 new coal folders be placed in Manchester restaurants and other public places throughout the town.

The 1950 folders are made in the shape of a miniature iron lung complete with small "glass" windows. The folders will be delivered to Mr. O'Connor and other city directors and targets. ## Coal Shortage Seen 'Critical' In 36 Cities

Chamber of Commerce Report Comes on Heels Of Truman's Denial Emergency Created

Washington, Jan. 12.—The U. S. Chamber of Commerce today reported a "critical" coal shortage in 36 cities, based on the heels of President Truman's statement that the three-day mine week has created a coal shortage.

The Chamber statement apparently was prepared before Mr. Truman's denial of a coal shortage conference yesterday that he has no immediate plan to force full production in the coal fields by using his War-Hartley act emergency injunction powers against the U. S. Lewis United Mine Workers.

The Chamber report stated that it had surveyed areas in 10 "principal industrial coal using states," with this result:

"With an average of less than seven days supply in the hands in 36 average sized towns surveyed, adequate supplies of coal for the winter season are in jeopardy. In these cities there is widespread suffering and hardship has been averted so far primarily because of the unseasonably high coal prices. Hardship 'Only Hours Away'."

The statement said that in some places such hardship is a matter of hours' stay."

In Chicago, the American Retail Coal Association said Mr. Truman's statement that the coal shortage is not as serious as the Chamber report stated is unwarranted.

## Ill-Fated Sub Down Quickly After Crash

Skipper of Tanker Aspects Damaged Craft Sank Within Minute After Ships Collide

Sherrona, England, Jan. 12.—The skipper of the ill-fated tanker which rammed the British freighter, carrying 76 men, said today the damaged craft sank within a minute after the collision.

Capt. Carl Homberg, his eyes misty as he talked to assembly aboard the vessel, said the sub had broken in two within a minute after the collision. The ship was clear, he said, and he would not be held responsible for the accident.

The 47-year-old captain brought his 100-ton tanker, the Divina, which was bound for the Thames estuary at the mouth of the Mersey river several hours after the collision.

The Divina, which carried the area of the collision for four hours, picked up eight survivors and two bodies from the wrecked tanker. The captain said he was not hurt, and after drinking coffee he began to get up the ship.
