She is associated with the Fabrion Chilena de Sedirias bertile mill in Vina del Mar. Chile. During her stay here she has lived at the Oak Lodge.

In an interview this morning. Miss Chabrat related some of her experiences as a social worker, her reasons for being in this country and what knowledge she has gained about women employment

She was awarded a training grant by the Women's Bureau, U. U. Department of Labor, for four months study of the employment of women in the United States, of their working conditions, of labor legislation affecting them; of health standards and counseling services in factories and other work establishments; of the education, health, and recreation programs of labor organizations; of women's participation in union activities; of community facilities for women workers, especially provisions for the care of children of working mothers. The training course in the Department of Labor, Women's Bureau, is part of the U. S. Government's program of cooperation with other countries. Here On Grant

countries.

A graduate, with honors, from the Elvira Matte de Cruchaga School of Social Work in Santiago, Chile, Miss Chabrat has been the industrial social worker in an important silk mill in Valpariso, Chile, for 15 years. During that time the company has established a medical service for its employes families, built the major portion of a large housing project, encouraged sports and recreational clubs among the workers, and at different times has offered educational classes. The factory also provides a day nursery and faciliides a day nursery and facili for children up to 13.

Her Work Extensive as fet y measures tich Miss Chabrat enforces, have been established by the company. She deals with various problems of the employees and their families, works with the doctor and nurse, and sees that the employees repor the annual medical examination which is required as part of assists the employees in enand in special classes when neces-sary. Miss Chabrat also secures assistance for workers who are building their own homes and works closely with the trade union. Asked about wages and the cost of living in Chile, Miss Chabrat "a good weaver earns be-ten and fifteen dollars a That is a fairly good wage, as it costs a family approximately one dollar a day to live, including food, rent, enterainment and a servant or maid. A tourist could live on about two dollars a day, so you can see that the cost of living is cheap." A maid receives a salary of about five dollars a month, she
