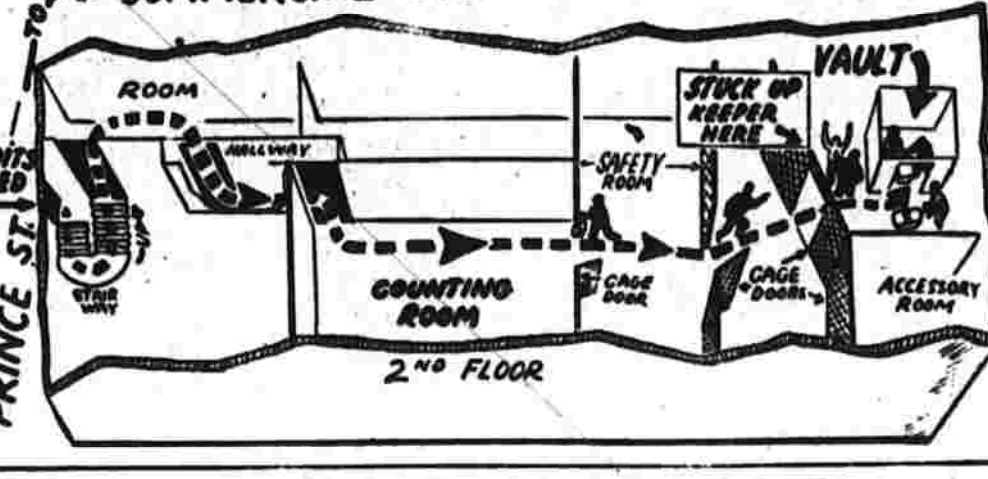

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**We Are Taken To Task**  
 To the Editor,  
 I must confess it is not very pleasant to think of arguing with the Editor of the Manchester Herald, even though it is sometimes easy to disagree with the Editor of us who have a temper and a thirst for justice" would always have to quarrel with a man who will write as so few editors of the daily press do write, "we have not yet come to accept the pure, naked right as an acceptable, practicable policy in itself."

Over twenty-five years ago, I remember one of my college professors remarking that the clash between our occidental civilization and a rising oriental one would probably take place, with the possible victory of the latter, before we had finished the twentieth century. 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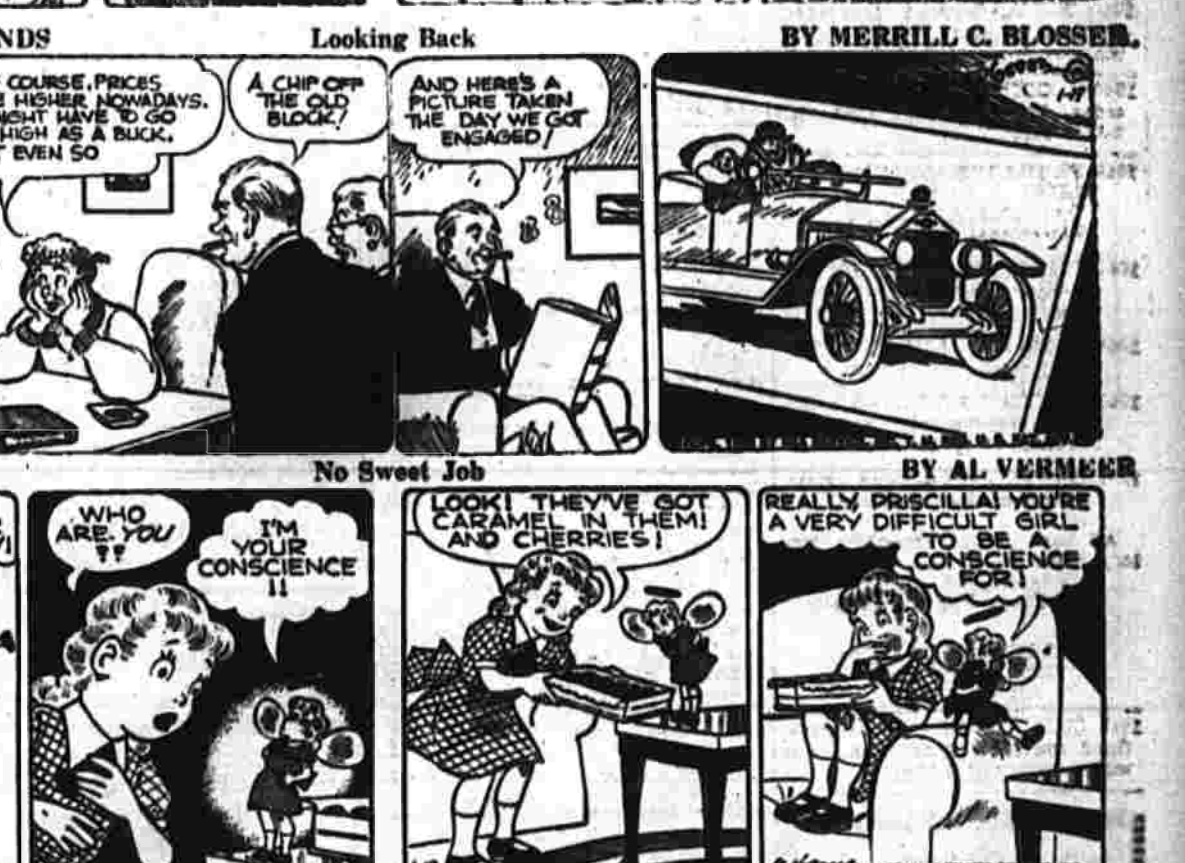
