Highway Case Again Argued
Thornton Land Settlement Still in Court as Claims Pressed
 The valuation dispute involving the land of the Manchester State Gravel Company on the Wilbur Cross highway and the State of Connecticut, which took the land for highway purposes, promises to run into still more dispute and argument, hearing on a remonstrance in the matter, filed by counsel for the State Highway Department, was held yesterday by Judge Edward J. Daly in Superior Court. The William J. Thornton, who operates the local sand and gravel enterprise, has been judged by a state referee to have sustained damages ranging from \$477,203.05 to \$319,410.74, depending on the value formula used. The Highway Department has offered the Thornton \$139,000 for the 15.2 acres of land involved.

"Impudent"
The government of Western Germany is continuing to behave as if it had won the war.

One thing is just done is to rebel against carefully nurtured western policy plans for a trade agreement between Western Germany and France. It had been assumed that this trade agreement was a sure thing. Now Western Germany refuses to sign—until it has its way on the issue of the Saar, which France is now trying to detach from Germany.

Another thing the Western German government has done was to announce the other day that gasoline rationing in Western Germany would end Feb. 1. This was announced without consultation with the Allied High Commission which is still supposed to be supervising affairs in Western Germany.

This action was considered by western Allied officials to be "impudent." Two facts make clear why it is considered "impudent." One is that the United States is still giving gasoline to Germany at the rate of \$25,000,000 a year. The other is that Britain, one of the nations which is supposed to have won the war, still has gas rationing.

Similarly, the Bonn government has announced the end of food rationing, although there is still food rationing in Britain, and although the United States is paying for German food imports.

In all these policies, Western Germany is actually bumping its nose at its creators. The steps it announces are naturally popular with the German people. If the Allies force the German government to withdraw its announcement that the rationing of gasoline will end Feb. 1, this will be an impossible step, but the western Allies have decided they must do something to notify the Germans that the Allies won the war, and are still on the scene in Germany.

But, from their current behavior, the Western German government will merely find some other way of dumping its nose.

Connecticut Yankee

It begins to appear that the Republican party will not be in the slightest about the oratorical, literary or hucksterlike qualifications of its prospective candidate for Governor. Whoever the nominee is, Willard E. Rogers is ready and willing to be the multiple for him.

The significance of Mr. Rogers' resignation from the State Development Commission is that it has cleared the way for his own full-time service to the Republican party. This party has for his kind a provision that the bill in question be not be reached by the Legislature or any other action on it postponed for another 21 days.

So, all session long yesterday, there was enacted a gag law which House Speaker John Hayburn developed popularly. He could, throughout the day, see and recognize legislators who had all kinds of business for the House. He even saw and recognized some committee members who had no business to bring bills to the floor.

But, throughout the long day, he was never capable of seeing and recognizing the Republican chairman who had the FEPC bill ready for action.

In the fear that it might possibly run out of other members of the FEPC, Speaker Rayburn, handled what business it did have in filibuster style.

So the House, after all was still prevented from taking action on the matter the Rules Committee wanted to block. And next month, when another "discharge" day arrives, presenting a session during which the rules will permit bringing up the FEPC bill, the same filibuster tactic, and the same limited vision on the part of Speaker Rayburn, can be expected to operate again.
