



Minneapolis, Jan. 25.—(P)—Dallas Scheidler, a former sailor, thinks the U.S.S. Missouri could be freed from the Chesapeake bay mud flat by employing a method he said he saw used with success in the Pacific during World war II. Scheidler suggests that the Navy sink pipes at an angle down the battleship's sides and then fill those pipes with air or steam under pressure so that bubbles form in the muck. As the bubbles burst, he claims, the released pressure will loosen the mud and it will be borne away on the current.

Scheidler, who served as a gunner's mate on a minesweeper, said he saw four ships freed that way, including one laden with concrete and stranded on a volcanic island. canic island.
