Not The Real Question
 All this headline business from Washington about the approaching decision on the hydrogen bomb is a deliberate effort to suppress public discussion of the issue, not necessarily to influence the Washington decision, but to prepare and ease the way for the public decision of the issue. It is supposed to ask itself, "Shall we make the hydrogen bomb?" It is supposed to debate that question with itself.

We submit that the question, as framed, is not debatable. We submit that it is totally impossible to undertake any serious discussion of the direct question of whether or not we should make the hydrogen bomb.

Debate and discussion are impossible because, in the context in which the question is framed, there is no choice. If this is an arms race, we must make the bomb. We make the bomb even though there is no guarantee that those who set it off will not use it so that delivering it would have to be a suicide mission. We make the bomb even though, obviously enough, it may be the madness of mankind on earth.

And Russia, too, will make the bomb. Doing this, Russia will have no more of a real choice than we. The question of whether or not we shall make the bomb is no question at all. If it is the kind of world it is, and we are going to allow it to remain this kind of world, the decision is automatic.

We make the bomb. Making it, we shall use it. Nor shall we have any quarrel if it is used against us. We ourselves would be the original atomic whistlers.

Giving us this fake question to decide is a stratagem which amounts to an evasion of the real question which is before us. This real question is the larger question to which the question of the hydrogen bomb is subordinate.

It is the question of whether or not we are going to have a war-determined world, whether or not we are going to continue to live by the rule of armaments race, whether we are going to concede its race, or whether we are going to save mankind, or concede its racial destruction.

The question before us is this: Are we willing, in company with all other nations and peoples, to renounce war completely? That is the direct question of our times. But officials here puts it directly. Officials here have formulated a policy which, in itself, proposes that question. Its policies are always formulated on the assumption that we are going to continue to tolerate war.
