Exemptions Should Be Listed on Tax Return

For Each One Rightfully Claimed \$600 Knocked Off Income Before Taxation

(Editor's Note: This is the third of 12 stories explaining who must do what and how about the 1949 income tax return.)

Washington, Feb. 15—(AP)—Watch your exemptions in making your 1949 income tax return. For each one you can rightfully claim \$600 is knocked off your income before what's left can be taxed.

Everyone who had \$600 or more income in 1949 must file a return. But—everyone who files a return is allowed a \$600 exemption for himself; plus \$600 if he was blind in 1949; plus \$600 if he was 65 or older in 1949.

2. If his wife had no income or files a joint return with him, he's allowed a \$600 exemption for her; plus \$600 if she was blind in 1949; plus \$600 if she was 65 or older in 1949.

3. And he's allowed a \$600 exemption for each dependent he can claim. That's all he gets for a dependent. There is no added \$600 exemption because a dependent is blind or is 65.

Not Classified Dependent
The rules governing wives and dependents are not the same because a wife is not classified as a dependent. So watch them.

The wife—
If she has any income, no matter how small, the husband can claim no exemption for her unless she files jointly with him.

What of a wife who is claimed as a dependent by someone else, such as her father, who may have supported her? Can she file jointly with her husband?

Yes, but then the person who supported her can't claim her. However, if she wants her father who supported her, to have her exemption she should not file a joint return with her husband. She can't be an exemption on two different returns.

Jobless Claim Totals Drop

Unemployment Benefit Decline in State Is Slight During Week

Hartford, Feb. 15—The number of jobless claimants for unemployment benefits in Connecticut declined slightly to 45,947 for the week ended February 11 from 46,240 for the previous week. During the corresponding week a year ago, there were 52,431 claimants.

Initial claims, which start new periods of unemployment, totaled 5,058 for the week as compared with 5,153 for the previous week and 7,604 for the same week a year ago.

Bridgeport was still highest in the number of jobless claimants with 7,422 followed by New Haven 7,214, Hartford 6,832 and Waterbury 4,214. Other offices were: New Britain 2,376, Stamford 2,285, Middletown 1,786, Meriden 1,609, New London 1,572, Torrington 1,391, Danbury 1,360, Danielson 1,143, Ansonia 1,222, Norwich 1,151, Bristol 1,109 and Norwalk 1,091.

Under 1,000 each were Thompsonville 956, Manchester 924 and Willimantic 417.

Exhaustions for the week numbered 1,250 making the total 7,500 since January 1.

Heart Illnesses Lead All Others

Heart disease continues to be the major cause of death among policyholders of The Mutual Life Insurance Company of New York, according to a mortality study made public today by G. J. Agostinelli, the company's field representative in Manchester.

The 200,000 in death benefits last year, the study of the company's 1949 experience showed that diseases of the heart and circulatory systems accounted for 26.8 per cent of fatalities in all age groups, cancer 15.8 per cent and accidents 4.5 per cent.

Among people under 40 years of age accidents led all other causes of death—accounting for almost one-third of all fatalities in that group.

Big Companies Cut Price of Fuel Oil

New Haven, Feb. 15—(AP)—Five major oil companies today announced a reduction in the retail price of fuel oil from 114 to 107 cents per gallon. A sixth announced a similar reduction was expected soon.

David Rubin, president of Benedict & Co., Inc. distributor for Cities Service, said the reduction at his firm became effective today. He attributed it to the warm weather and the piling up of stock to create a surplus.

The Rocky Vacuum Oil company announced a similar reduction which went into effect yesterday. A spokesman there said the

drop was due to a price reduction at "refinery level."

Other major companies which announced a drop in fuel oil are the Shell Oil company, the Esso City Filling Station, Inc. distributor for Esso Standard Oil Co., and the Atlantic Refining company.

The Gulf Oil Corp. was the only major company which did not report a price reduction, but a spokesman there said one is expected to follow the major firms.

World Prayer Day on Feb. 24

To Be Celebrated on First Friday in Lent; "Faith" to Be Theme

"Faith for Our Time" is the theme of the World Day of Prayer to be celebrated this year in more than 10,000 communities across the country on the first Friday in Lent, February 24.

The World Day of Prayer was originated in 1947 by an American woman, Mrs. Darwin R. James, who asked women of the Presbyterian Church to pray on a specified day for mission work in this country. The day became an annual event in which other denominations joined.

This year it will be celebrated by Christians in 92 countries from the Fiji Islands, across the international date line, to the Arctic and tropical regions on the other side of the world. The prayer offerings will help support mission work around the world. Offerings last year in the United States alone amounted to over a quarter of a million dollars.

The service for this year was written by a Japanese woman, Miss Michi Kawai, YWCA leader and founder of a girls' school near Tokyo, and the poster for the World Day of Prayer, depicting the kneeling Christ, was designed by a Japanese artist, Mr. Tetsui Sasaki.

Russians Sign New Treaties With Chinese

(Continued from Page One)

Japanese peace treaty or not later than 1952. They provide that:

1. The Soviet Union will transfer to China all its rights in the Changchun railway, which runs through southern Manchuria and connects with the Soviet port of Vladivostok.
2. Soviet troops will be withdrawn from the jointly operated naval base at Port Arthur, Manchuria, in the district which will be turned over to the Soviet Union for their restoration and for building carried out since 1945.
3. Administration in the free port of Dairen is to be transferred from Russian management to Chinese, and all properties owned or leased in Manchuria by Russia are to be returned to China.
4. To grant credits.
5. Russia also agreed to grant \$300,000,000 in credits over a five-year period for the purchase of Russian-made industrial equipment and other material. The credits are divided into 100,000,000 year's instalments of \$60,000,000 and are to be repaid in 10 annual payments at one per cent interest, beginning in 1952.

The text of the agreement calls for the loan to be calculated in American dollars.

The foreign ministers also exchanged notes providing for the transfer to China of "all buildings, stocks, bonds, and other property." This obviously referred to military barracks set up in Peking by the old Czarist Russian regime.

One part of the friendship treaty says the contracting parties "declare their readiness in all international relations to cooperate to ensure peace and security throughout the entire world and to support the peaceful realization of these objects."

Wang Pao-chai with Japan

The two nations agree to work for conclusion in the shortest space of time a peace treaty with the Japanese which will be equal to the Japanese with the other allies in World War II.

An auxiliary note to the main agreement calls for recognition by the Soviet Union of the Mongolian People's Republic (Outer Mongolia).

Another such note provides that Russia will return to China without cost all property acquired by Soviet organizations from Manchuria and the property owners in Manchuria.

Gasoline War Possible Here

Dealers Aroused Over Price Situation; Say Competition Unfair

An effort apparently made to 'let the little gas dealer survive' by holding up gasoline prices in Manchester, today was threatening to flash into a price war. Some dealers, who at a meeting, held last week apparently had agreed to go along in maintaining a price here, today weren't so sure they would do so.

It was claimed today that Manchester's gas stations, selling at 24.5 cents, are losing out to Hartford's flow at as low as 20.9 for the better known brand. Some dealers claim that the Hartford competition has cut their sales down to half in volume.

Asked this morning if he would comment on the situation, a dealer here said that he has heard nothing of any disagreement on prices today. He said there had been a meeting last week, called because of the smaller stations were threatened with closing if cut-rate prices were not maintained.

In an effort to 'let the little fellow survive,' Hartford's larger dealers had agreed to keep a price level that would continue until no price war was started.

At the Hartford rate, he observed, many here would simply have to close up.

He explained that there has been a flurry of price cuts by several dealers who have been selling "sub-specification gas."

He mentioned a four-cent cut advertised here this week, which he said could not be made by small competitors if they were to operate at cost.

Mortuary said he feels that larger dealers should not force the small man out of a price war, but that there should be mutual respect and consideration. This business, he said, should not be a "dog eat dog" proposition.

On the other hand Eugene McClure, who sells gasoline at his automobile agency, said today that local price levels are forcing him out of business.
