Placement Must Meet Zoning Regulations in All Instances

Attention of the public was called today by Building Inspector David Chambers to the fact that several business establishments are not following the zoning regula-

tions on the placement of advertising signs. He noted that, with-out special permission, no signs are allowed in residential zones, and in other zones all standing signs must be back at least 20 feet from the street line.

Complaint has been made to his office, Chambers said, that in some instances price signs for various commodities including gasoline, have been placed in violation of the regulations, which he stated will be strictly enforced.

He said that he has personally warned several establishments on the placing of signs, and would appreciate co-operation to avoid further action.

socialist victory in the English election.

The Dixie Democrats, led by the president himself, complained about the speech. Mr. Truman summed over the civil rights issue with a pledge that the Democrats are going to "break down the barriers to economic liberty and political liberty that have been created by prejudice and discrimination."

 Lieutenant General Leslie R. Groves, Director of the atomic bomb project, made a speech at Stamford Monday in which he asserted that there has been too much talk in this country about preserving "academic freedom" and the right to individual opinions.

 What is at issue is merely the application of this Commandment in their own individual conduct? Or does it also apply to collectors of individuals, joined together in the form of nations?
 If it applies to nations as well as to individuals, then it is just as morally important to eliminate war by slaughter as it is to eliminate war by hydrogen bomb.
 If the Commandment does not apply to nations, then there is nothing wrong with the hydrogen bomb. It is merely the best weapon we can design, and we ought to be very pleased to be able to have it. By itself, it poses no new moral question of any kind, and calling any interfaith conference on the assumption that it does would be a silly procedure.
 All the churches have to do is decide whether or not they approve of war. If they do, they have no valid reason for being against the hydrogen bomb. If they are against war, that, merely one of its weapons, should be their topic.

Rockville Centre, N. Y., Feb. 18.—(AP)—A crowded Long Island railroad train ran through a red light on a makeshift siding last night and sliced into an oncoming train, killing at least 28 persons. More than 100 other persons were injured as the two trains—loaded with about 1,000 passengers—were ripped lengthwise in half. Motorman Jacob Kiefer, 65, of 69 Church, Rockville, N. Y., was arrested and charged with second degree manslaughter by District Attorney Frank Glotta, who said: "He ran past the signal."
