Czech Press Hits Shortage of Eggs

Prague, Czechoslovakia, Feb. 24.—The controlled press complains that farmers haven't delivered enough eggs to the government this year to make an omelet.

The newspaper Lidova Demokracie said that the egg quota in the Slovakian region of Kocise was fulfilled in the first six weeks of this year by only 3 per cent.

"There are even some districts which during the last seven weeks did not deliver a single egg," the paper said. "One of the richest districts, Trebova, delivered only 70 eggs and this district has to deliver 1,400,000 eggs this year."

U. S. Transport Chief C. A. Dix reported three West German barges loaded with scrap iron from West Berlin to Hamburg were released last night after German officials at Brandenburg.

But four East German barges with similar cargoes bound for West Germany were still detained. Dix said the four craft presumably were suspected of smuggling scrap from the Russian zone, which is suffering a metal famine.

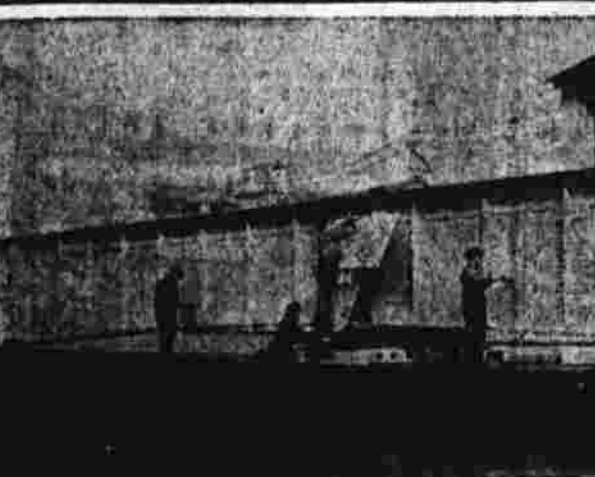

With a new banking house, experienced staff and the most modern equipment, the First National Bank of Manchester opens its doors to the public for its first day of business tomorrow at 11 a. m. Banking will continue until 3 p. m. Tomorrow, as well as all residents in this area are invited to attend the formal opening and to meet the members of the Board of Directors, the officers and staff of the new institution, advertised as "The Friendly Bank."

The bank will open as Mayor Harold A. Turkington cuts a ribbon across the doorway, and in brief ceremonies the business will be inaugurated. The new bank is headed by the mayor, General Manager George H. Waddell, State Police Commissioner Edward J. Hickey, State Banking Commissioner Richard F. Houtart and Deputy Raymond K. Elmore. Chief of Police J. Hurley of Boston, Michigan bank examiner and City S. Merrill, senior vice-president of the Merchants National Bank of Boston, representing the Federal Reserve System of which Manchester's new bank is a member. Also on hand will be President Willard B. Rogers and his board. It is expected that General Manager Waddell will make the town's initial deposit.

The bank has over 300 stockholders, representing a broad base of control, and it is reported that the opening day's deposits some half million dollars to represent funds not formerly invested through local banks, but are withdrawals of funds or business from other out of town institutions.

Among the 30 separate banking services offered by the bank are usual bank and mortgage accommodations, a drive-in teller's window and large parking space.

Records equipment is installed, and the bank has secured the first of a new type of automatic book-keeping machines manufactured by National Cash Register Company. All of the other equipment is of the most modern—the telephone bells ring and signal by light; special cash safeguards have been built in, and the interior is richly finished and furnished.

The job of bank organization was started here about a year ago when a small group of citizens that the town is large enough to support another banking enterprise and surveys made and submitted to federal agencies confirmed this view.

The bank is chartered by the government and holds membership in the federal reserve, federal insurance and other banking and security groups.
