Presumably they will no longer figure the value of goods exchanged in their barter deals with other countries in terms of dollars as was done in the recent Chinese-Russian agreement. They apparently will figure values in terms of rubles and since they have now declared a higher value for the ruble this may project a direct effect of causing Russian goods to be given greater value in barter trade with other countries.

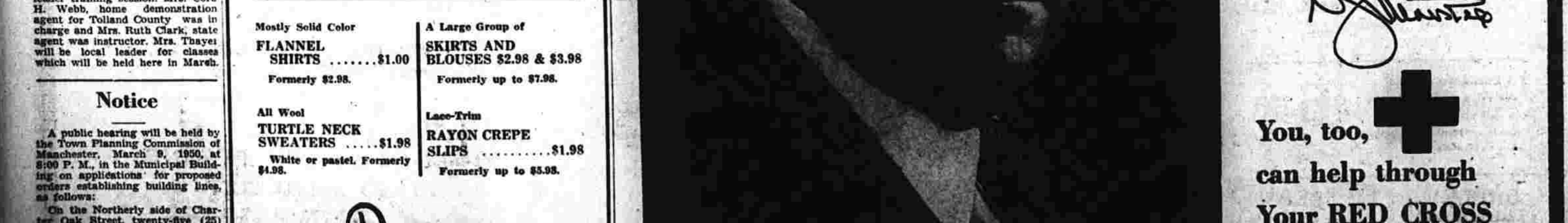

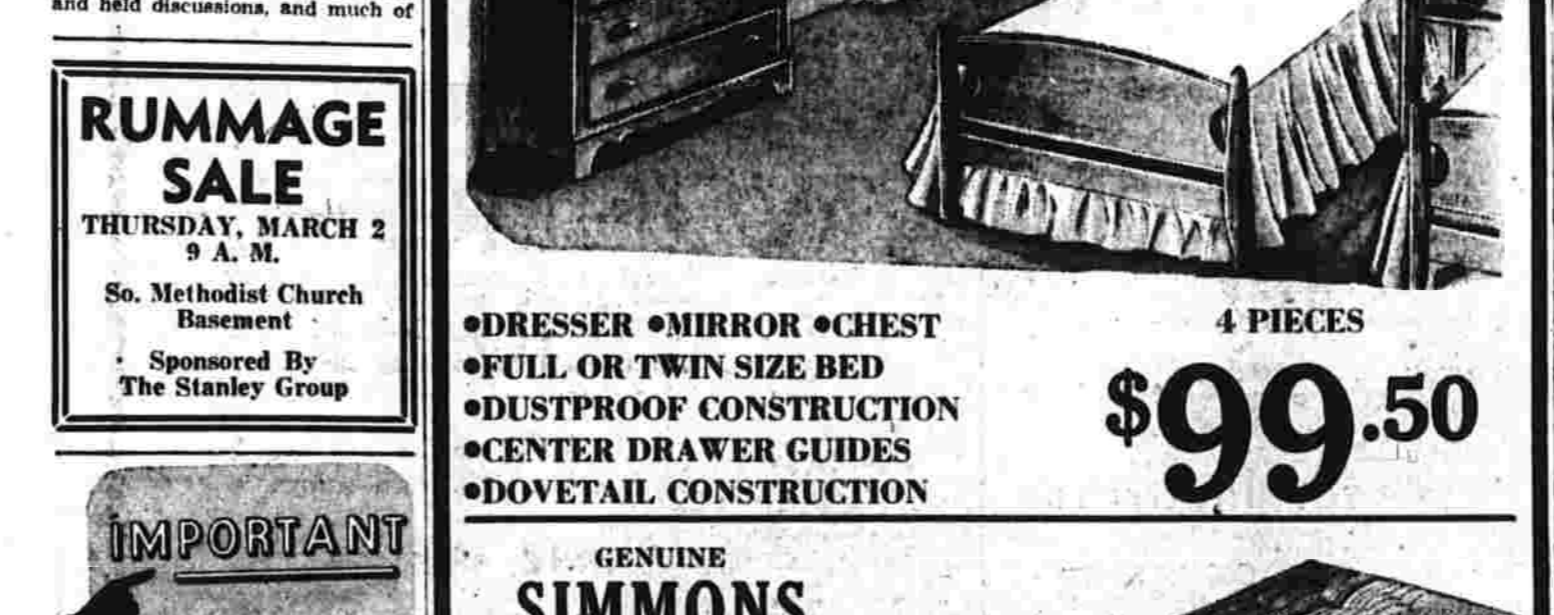

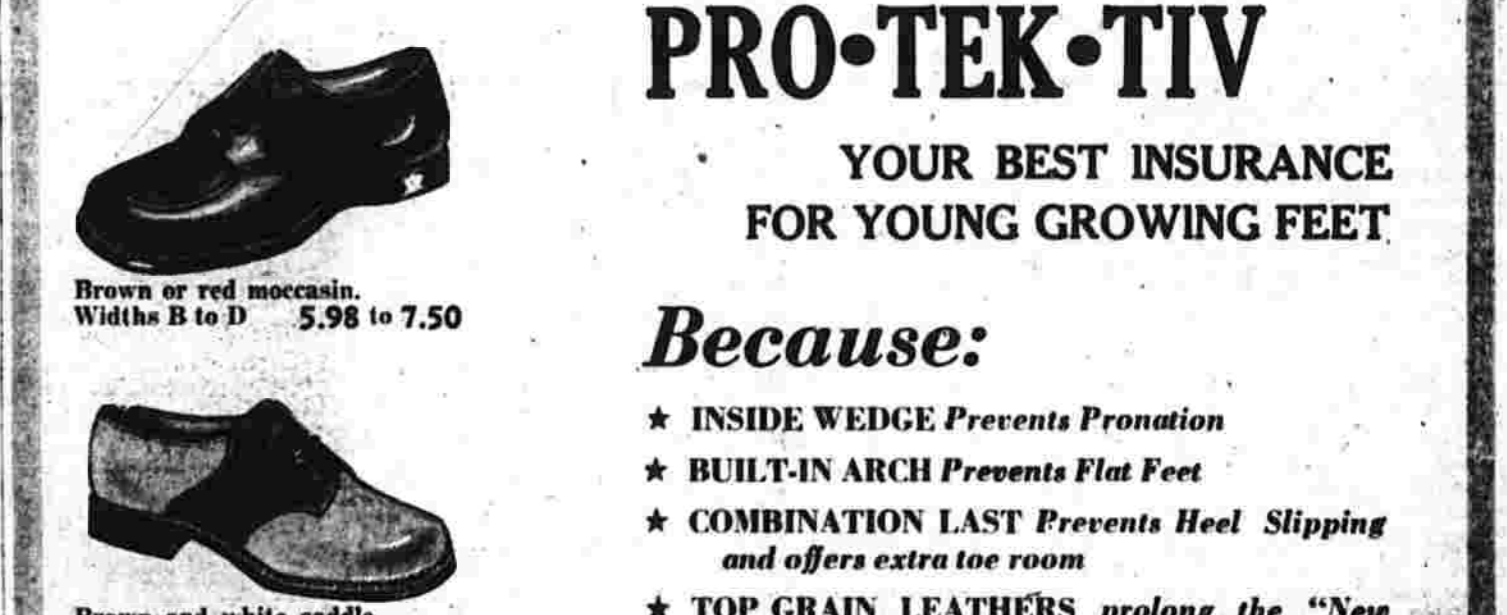

Circle Hears Decor Detail

St. Margaret's Group Is Given Talk by Mrs. H. B. DeWolf at Home

Mrs. Margaret's Circle, Daughters of Isabella, heard an excellent talk on "Early American Decorations" last evening, given by Mrs. H. B. DeWolf at the K. of C. Home. She said in part: "When considering early decoration, we find the art of stenciling was used by the Chinese and introduced in Byzantine art and in early European cathedrals. Early stenciling often contained the acanthus leaf and a star. Stenciling was used as a short cut to an object of beauty."

The art of decorating linens was brought into America from Wales and England. Many Chinese pieces had been brought into these countries and the people wanted to reproduce the beauty of their decorative art. Early pieces were made of a thin plate of iron, coated with ink and then decorated gaily, but often crudely.

"The manufacture began in 1760 in Berlin, Connecticut, and soon its articles were sold around the country, and so the public became acquainted with it. Paul Revere made tin articles, making the first blue-edge trays and engaging a relative to decorate them. Many early stencil kits as well as early decorated tin pieces are in museums today."

Among the interesting pieces displayed by Mrs. DeWolf as examples of this fascinating art were several Hitchcock chairs, three-inch hole handle tray, old churn used as a mending box, an old milk pail done in brushed, old coffee pot, saucer tray, old bun tray with elongated bottom, a mirror showing decoration on glass, old crumb-er and a beautiful coffee table and tray.

At the conclusion of the program coffee and cherry pie were served at a table attractively decorated with red, white and blue candles, and a centerpiece of red tulips with white and blue sweet peas.
