The wreckage hung so precariously to a rocky ledge that rescuers had to haul it down before they could remove the woman and child and lower them by ropes to waiting stretchers below. The body of the pilot was left in the plane overnight. Corrihan found that it was foggy and raining at the time, that the woman ran directly in front of Ruben's car and that it was impossible for Ruben to avoid striking her. "In my opinion she should not have undertaken to cross this main highway," Corrihan said, "and she found a time when the road was relatively free of traffic. She attempted it in the midst of heavy traffic and then to have run into the path of this car was exercising poor judgment to say the least."
