D. A. R. Enjoys Talk on India
Idealistic Land of Gandhi Seen Key to Destiny of All Asia
At the meeting of Oxford Parish Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, at the Mary Cheney Library yesterday afternoon at 2:30, Rev. Willard J. McLaughlin of the North Methodist church, substituting for Mrs. McLaughlin, who was unable to be present, gave a most interesting talk on India.

At the beginning of his talk he spoke of the political implications of the swiftness of the peoples of Asia. Whether we like it or not, the "Great East," which we have had its day of leadership of the affairs of the world, and its leadership is gradually passing to Asia, much of which has already been taken over by Communism.

India, however, is the paradigm of Asia, and "the India goes, so goes Asia." At the present time it is the only country in Asia which has its house in order under the flag of freedom. Its location is a strategic one. Since August, 1947, the country has been a commonwealth, and since January, 1950, it has been a free sovereign republic. This result was brought about by the leadership of Mahatma Gandhi, whose pattern was set by four thousand years of Hindu culture. Since recorded history India has been a melting pot of diverse peoples. Its history is shot through with a large portion of Christian and democratic idealism.

"Techniques of Peace"
The remains of a very ancient civilization, contemporary with that of Mesopotamia, indicate that these ancient peoples had a knowledge of warfare and were a peace loving race. This is significant in that modern India was freed by the techniques of non-violence, not by war, the speaker said.

As a result of some of its contacts with European countries, India has a fine system of communism.

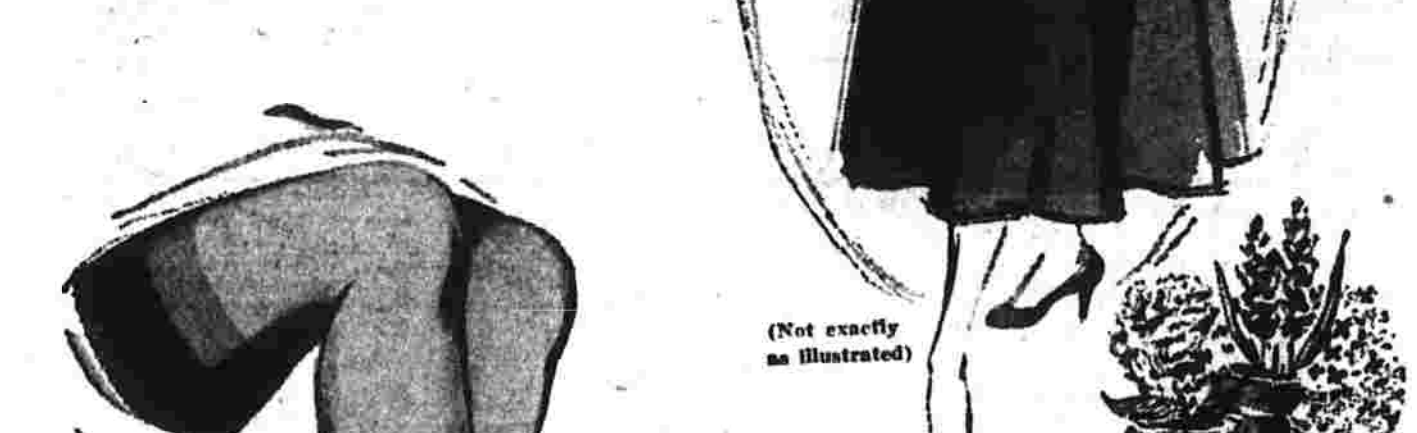

Pittsburgh, March 4.—(AP)—Industries crippled by the big soft coal strike looked to Washington today for the green light to get production rolling again. More than 225,000 persons have been laid off because of the "no contract no work" strike of 372,000 United Mine Workers.
